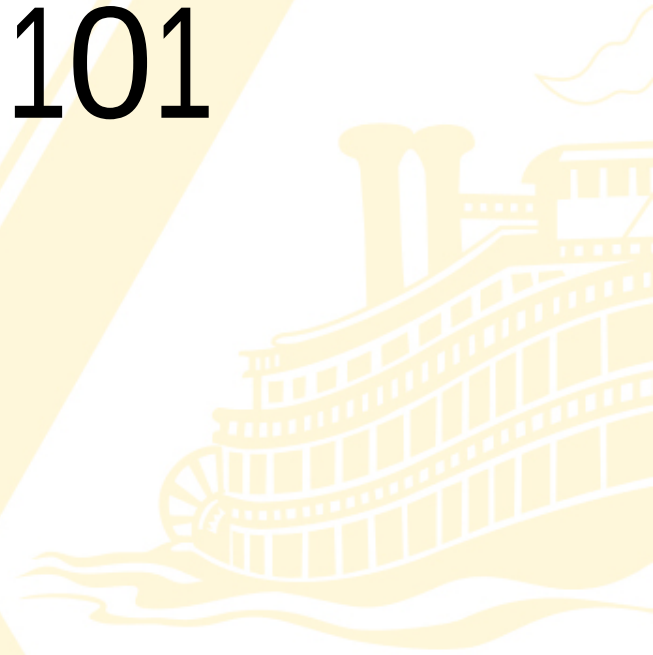


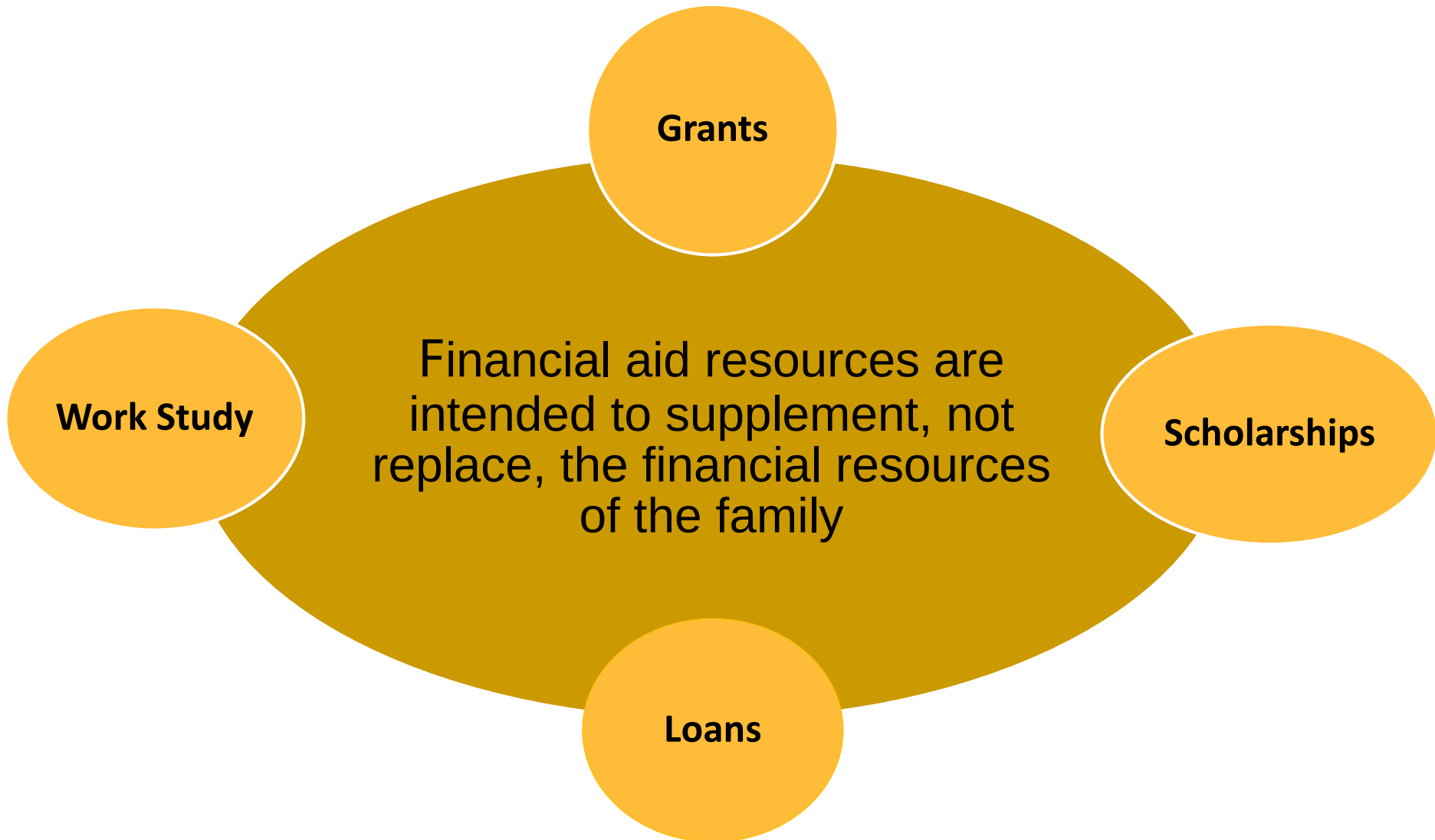

Delta College Grants

- **AB19-Grant : Pays for all tuition fees (cannot be eligible for the CA College Promise Grant)**

- Free Tuition for the First Academic Year of Full-Time Students who meet the following eligibility requirements:
 - Student must be a First Time student at Delta College
 - Student must be enrolled in 12 or more units per semester
 - Student must complete a FAFSA or CA Dream Act application for the academic year in which they are a First Time Student.
 - Student must **NOT** be receiving any other waiver of fees, such as the California College Promise Grant.
- If a student meets the above criteria, their tuition fees will be paid for in their first two academic years.
 - An Academic Year is defined as the Summer, Fall, and Spring terms of the 1st academic year only.

- The following chart illustrates the potential annual awards for a dependent student with a Cal Grant B/C award during the Fall and Spring terms.

If you take...	Pell Grant Award	Cal Grant B/C	Student Success Completion Grant	Total Aid
Five Classes per Semester (15 Units)	\$6,195	\$1,672/\$1,094	\$4,000	\$11,867*/\$11,289*
Four Classes per Semester (12 units)	\$6,195	\$1,672/\$1,094	\$1,298	\$9,165/\$8,587
Three Classes per Semester (9 units)	\$4,647	\$1,672/\$1,094	Not eligible	\$6,319/\$5,741
Two Classes per Semester (6 units)	\$3,098	\$1,672/\$1,094	Not eligible	\$4,770/\$4,192
One Class per Semester (3 units)	\$1,500	Not eligible	Not eligible	\$1,500

*\$11,867 or 11,289 plus the CA College Promise Grant (waives all tuition fees) would cover the annual cost of attendance for the above dependent student completing 15 units per semester!

Cal Grant A  Up to \$12,570 @ UC **OR** Up to \$5,742 @ CSU

Cal Grant B  \$1,672 your **1st year** and then:

\$1,672 + Up to \$12,570 @ UC **OR** \$1,672 + Up to \$5,742 @ CSU **OR** \$1,672 every year at a 2-year College

Please Note: If you use your Cal Grant eligibility beyond 2 years at a community college, you'll be using up Cal Grant eligibility that you may instead want to save if you're planning to transfer to a four-year college.

Cal Grant C  \$1,094 for up to 2 years if pursuing a career or technical educational

- Outside Scholarships
 - Local or national scholarships that are available to students, but NOT overseen by Delta College.
 - Use reputable search engines to avoid scams ([FastWeb.com](https://www.fastweb.com)).
 - When searching for scholarships, if it seems to good to be true...it probably is. You should never have to pay for a scholarship.

Students are disqualified if they do not meet the following SAP standards for two consecutive semesters:

- Not maintaining a **2.0** Cumulative GPA and/or not completing **67%** of enrolled units (cumulative and for the semester)
 - A student taking two 3 unit classes for the summer must pass all their classes
 - $3 \text{ (number of units completed)} / 6 \text{ (number of units taken)}$
- Exceeding the Maximum Time Frame
 - Students have up to 90 units to complete their A.A. degree



- **6 year lifetime Pell eligibility limit**

- **Consortium Form**

- Combine units taken at other colleges.

- **Book Advance Program**

- Submit all required documents to complete your financial aid file.
- Submit a Book Advance Request by contacting your specialist, at the information desk in the DeRicco Building, or visit the Financial Aid Window.
- Book Advance Request will be processed in 2 business days.
- Book Advance Voucher is worth up to \$750.
