School Improvement Goals:

2018-19 Year's Progress on goals:

Goal 1

Increase student literacy:

Increase the percentage of K-3 students who are at benchmark by 3% from BOY to EOY in the 2018-19 school year.

*Achieved goal

2018 –19 BOY Students at benchmark-75%

2018-19 EOY Students at benchmark- 85%

85% of grades 4-6 students will score at or above benchmark on EOY DIBELS composite in the 2018-19 school year.

Goal 2

Academic Proficiency:

80% of students in grades 3-6 will score 85% or higher on SAGE Benchmark tests in math after intervention.

No benchmark data was made available.

Increase math CRT proficiency by 2% in 2019 as compared to 2018

2017-18 CRT Math proficiency 87.1%

2018-19 CRT Math proficiency 89.3 %

Goal 3

Instruction:

Implement STEM Teaching and learning processes into every classroom. The average score on Evaluate Davis indicator T.5 “learners have opportunities to engage in higher level thinking” will increase to 3.0.

Goal 4

Character Building:

Create a Jr. Hope Squad for the school. Three advisers will teach student curriculum and oversee the program. The Hope Squad will promote peer support, eliminate loneliness and foster friendship on the playground. This initiative will spread the message of inclusion and kindness throughout the school.

2019-20 Improvement Goals

Kaysville Elementary goals support the 3 areas of focus identified by the district: Personalized Learning, Social & Emotional Learning, and Safety and Security.

Goal 1

Increase student literacy:

Seventy-five percent of students in grades K-3 will show "typical" or higher progress on the MOY DIBELS Pathways to Progress

In 2018-19 MOY Dibels pathway, K-3 showed 73% “typical” or higher progress.

Goal 2

Academic Proficiency:

Increase student Math proficiency in grades 4-6 by 2% according to Rise Testing

Goal 3

Social and Emotional Learning:

Classroom teachers will implement a Social Emotional Learning Curriculum, teaching 22 lessons within the school year with the completion date of March 1, 2020.

Curriculum purchased and teachers have begun instruction

Goal 4

Character Building:

Create and support a HOPE Squad at Kaysville Elementary

Peer nominations took place. HOPE squad has begun presenting in classrooms

Goal 5

Increase student ability to apply learned principles within science core standards through problem solving and collaboration.
