Today, we are fortunate enough to have a brief interview with Mr. Good and ask his opinion on this past play and future plans.

What do you think about past play?

Although I think it was a fun play to do, but I almost didn't do it. I had trouble with two characters, the Easter bunny and the Tooth Fairy. I thought it is way too strange to put in play. However, once I saw what Jerry and Franklin did with the two characters, I knew that this play was going to be fun.

What areas do you think actors often ignore its importance?

The reason that I would love students to get off-script sooner is that I want them to get to the character physically. Most students believe that saying the lines is the most important thing. In my opinion, that is not the case. I think it is only the tip of an iceberg, the real acting is when you physicalize everything you say.

Is there any area of improvement in terms of everyone?

I would love to have more time organizing the play and do more scenes. There are always things to do that drags us down. If we have more time, the boys will improve. Starting from tech rehearsal to the final closing night, each time the cast improves twice as much as before. Without any doubt, I would love more people to be involved. Although it is incredibly difficult to organize a large cast, I believe the boys can overcome this challenge.

Is there anything students learn from Drama class that helps make a successful play?

Certainly. The stage awareness and stage language make rehearsal more efficient. The students learn by themselves to make the play better. But the biggest thing is that the audience is incredibly responsive to the plays. I believe the audience's attitude toward the play is what they learn from the class. The audience has been terrific and the actors appreciate them, and this helps them to perform more confidently. There are lots of ways of acting and I think the class helps.

Are There any specific plays that you might do next spring?

I am still recovering from the spring play but I have thought of a possible version of a Shakespeare play. And I had a request for something darker, like a scary play. Someone has also reached out to me to ask for a musical play. I love to consider all things, but I have to find the right material for the boys and for Cardigan.

This year's fall play is called, "A Simple Task." The play is a comedy about a woman named Empie. Her first assignment at her new job is quite simple, retrieve a box of merchandise and deliver it to the boss. BUT what if your delivery is obstructed by confusing characters? There are 17 speaking parts/roles in the play.
