Anthony Currell (b.1942) is a British Artist whose career spans six decades. Currell studied at the Bideford School of Art (1957-60), the L.C.C Central School of Arts and Crafts (1960-63) and Atelier 17 in Paris (1963-64). He began his teaching career at Harris College in Preston in 1964, moving on to Plymouth College of Art in 1966 and Chesterfield College of Art in 1980 where he stayed until 2002.

Throughout his career Currell's work has been highly acclaimed and his prints in particular have been selected for International Print Biennales from 1975 onwards. In 1976 he was elected as a Full Member of the Printmakers Council of Great Britain. Currell's prints form part of collections worldwide including The V&A, London; Brooklyn Museum, New York; The Museum of Modern Art (MOMA), New York and Centre Culturel, Belgium, amongst other public and private collections.
