

Dear Families and Friends of The Woodlands Christian Academy,

On behalf of our Governance Board, administration and faculty, we are pleased to present this annual report, summarizing highlights from the 2018-2019 school year.

At Woodlands Christian, we strive to equip leaders – spiritually, academically, physically and socially – to fulfill God’s purpose for each of their lives. Through His transforming power, we believe that students can find their unique gifts and talents and reach their highest potential. Thus, we offer a rigorous, Christian, college-preparatory curriculum, taught by an engaging faculty that delivers the personal mentoring and encouragement necessary to help our students succeed and develop a love of learning. Whether in the classroom, at an athletic competition, or on the mission field, we challenge our students to become servant-leaders for Christ, capable of making an eternal impact for His kingdom.

This was another exciting year at Woodlands Christian as we celebrated our 25 year anniversary. We achieved record student enrollment and added a 63,000 square foot high school building to our campus. Most importantly, we rejoiced daily in the maturation and triumphs of our wonderfully talented students.

As a testament to our strong academics and co-curricular programs, the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and AdvancEd renewed our accreditation for five years. For the first time, we were named a Member of Council within the Council of Educational Standards and Accountability (CESA), which includes 32 of the top evangelical, college-preparatory schools in the United States. We also retained our status as an Apple Distinguished School.

We value our responsibility as financial stewards. Tuition and fees cover 100% of our operating expenses enabling us to use additional fundraising dollars to enhance our campus and programs. We have received clean, unqualified audits for each of the

past 13 years, and debt service is less than 2% of our operating expenses. Based on our ethical financial fundraising and board practices, Woodlands Christian is fully accredited by the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA).

in relationships with families, employees, donors, accreditation agencies, and the greater community. The Governance Board hires only one employee, the Head of School, and delegates all day-to-day operations through explicit governing policies to the Head of School.

Ultimately, the Governance Board represents God and the moral owners of our school. Moral owners include parents, faculty and members of the greater Christian community who share the vision for the school and have a vested interest in its success.

Reflections from Israel

Pack light. That was the advice we received from our fearless leader, Julie Ambler, who managed to pack for almost two weeks in the tiniest suitcase known to man. As I reflect on our trip to Israel, I realize that Jesus also told his followers to pack light. As we traveled from Jaffa to Galilee and Jerusalem to Nazareth and Bethlehem, we walked the paths Jesus walked. We visited the place of the Sermon on the Mount and the shoreline where Jesus told Peter and Andrew to "Come, follow Me." They didn't spend time filling their giant rolling suitcase like I did; they left immediately and carried only what they wore. Our group visited the place of Jesus' birth; Mary and Joseph also packed light – no diaper bag for the

Baby Jesus. In Capernaum, and where He spent most of His earthly ministry, Jesus performed miracles and ministered to people all without a man-bag. We took a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee – the very waters on which Jesus walked! He literally slept on a boat with no room for cargo. We prayed at the Western Wall and walked the Via Dolorosa upon which Jesus carried His cross. We observed Golgotha where Jesus took on the sins of the world, and then we took communion at the Garden Tomb where Jesus left his earthly burial clothes. Throughout our experiences, we learned that while we all have our own baggage to carry, Jesus makes the burden light and His message simple.

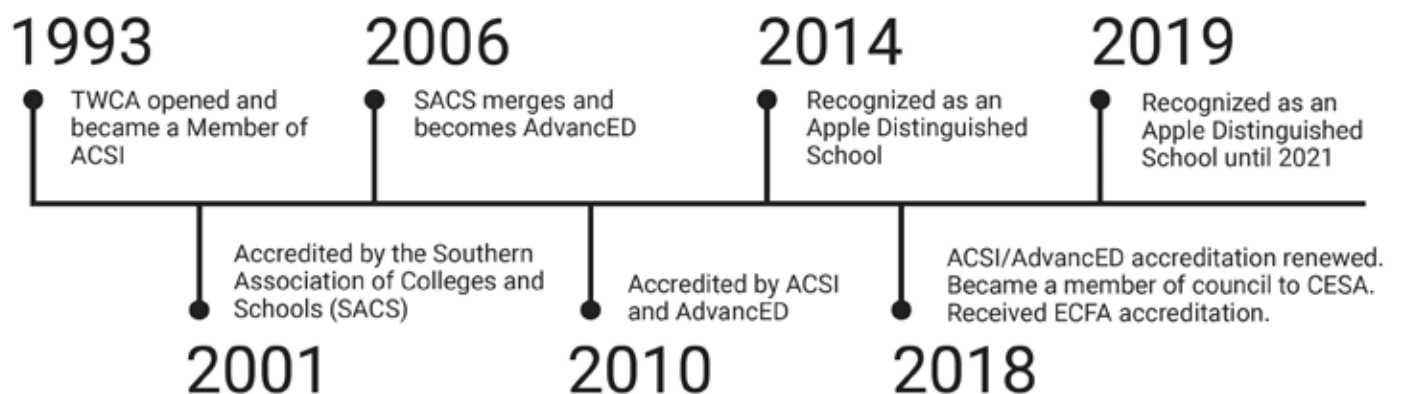
ACCREDITATION

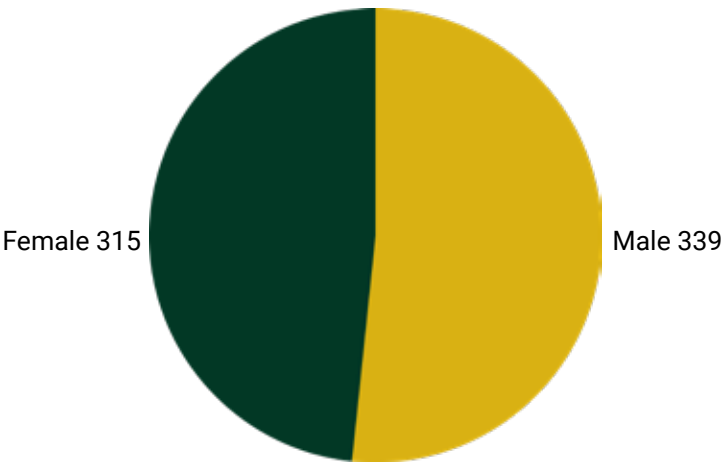

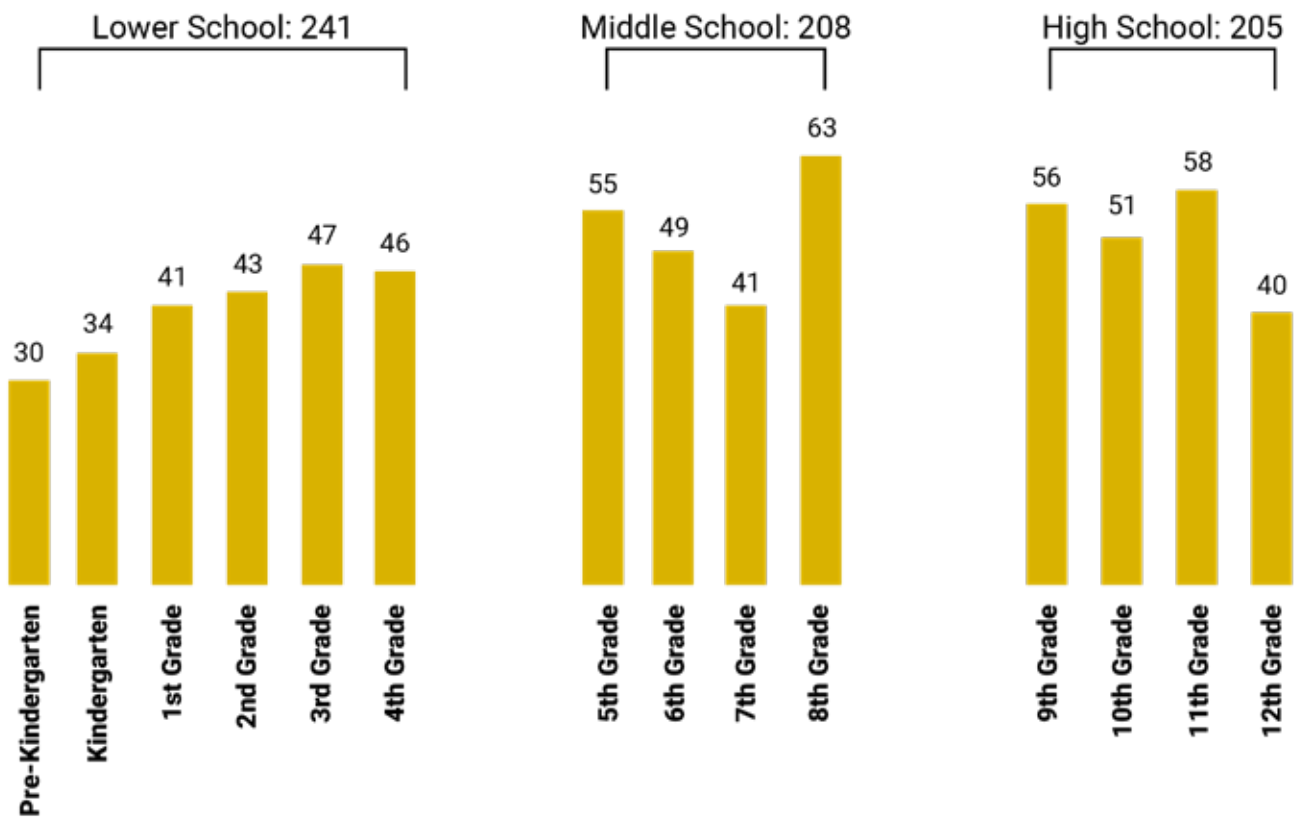

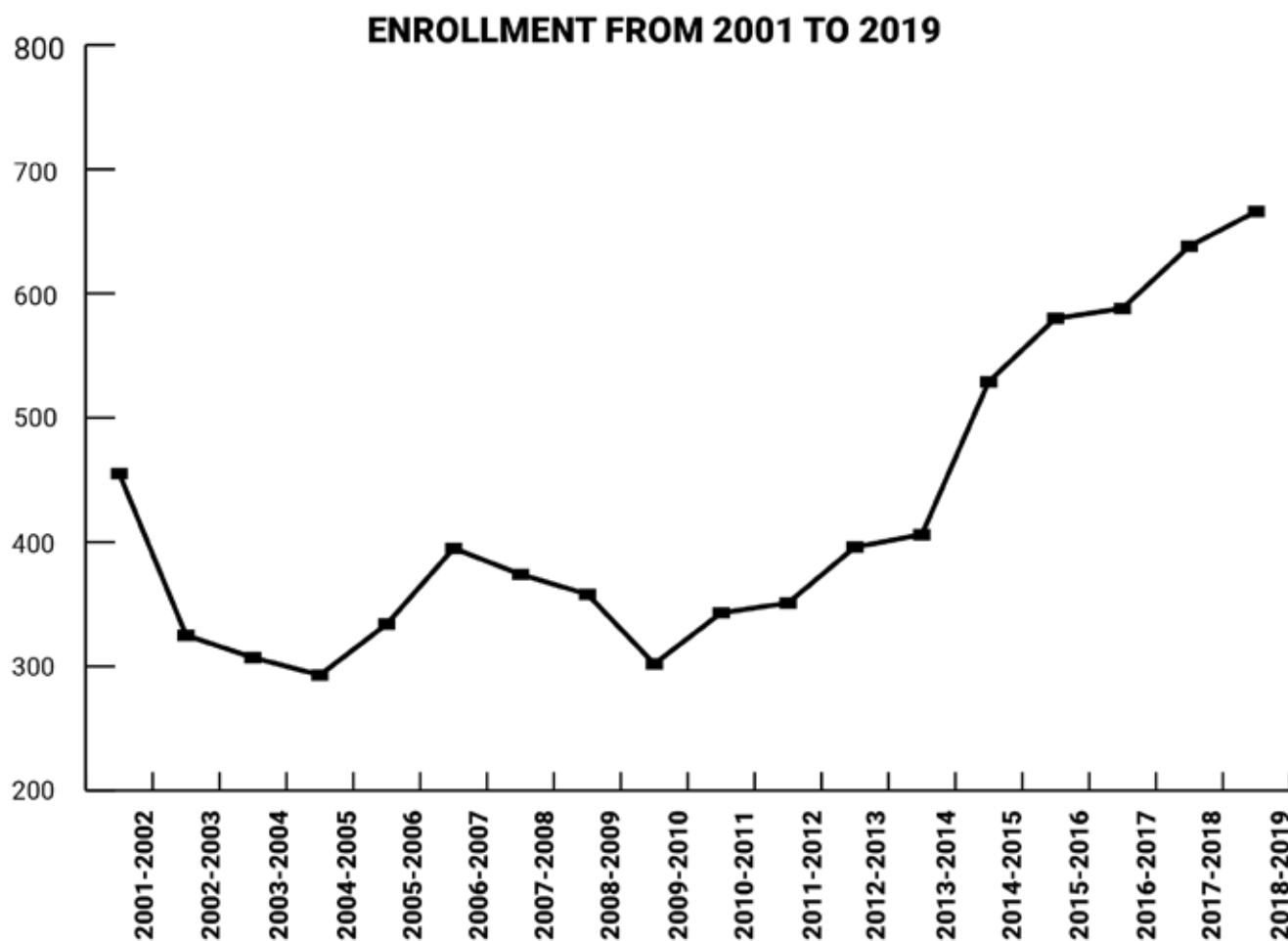
Enrollment by Division

WARRIORS SERVING IN ECUADOR

This marks the eighth year Woodlands Christian has partnered with Kairos church in the small town of Puyo. The theme for the mission trip was “people over projects”. Students went in with the understanding that building relationships with people is more important than completing projects or accomplishing tasks on a to-do list. Students and faculty went so far as to not use their cell phones for two days in order to focus on interacting and engaging with others. Ultimately, building relationships with the people and with each other made the most impact on the high school students, more than any good work they contributed.

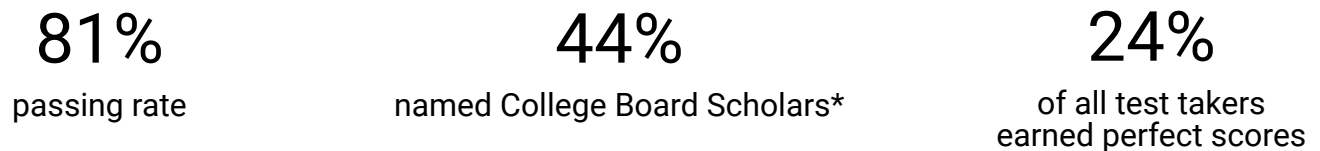

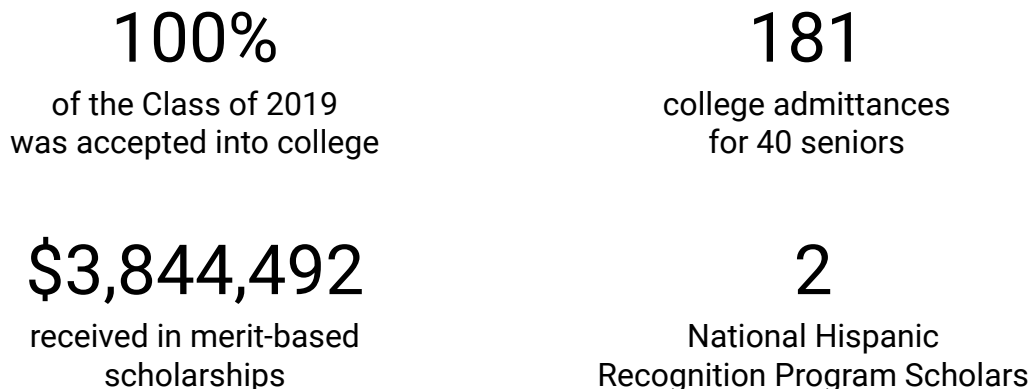
SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST (SAT) AVERAGES

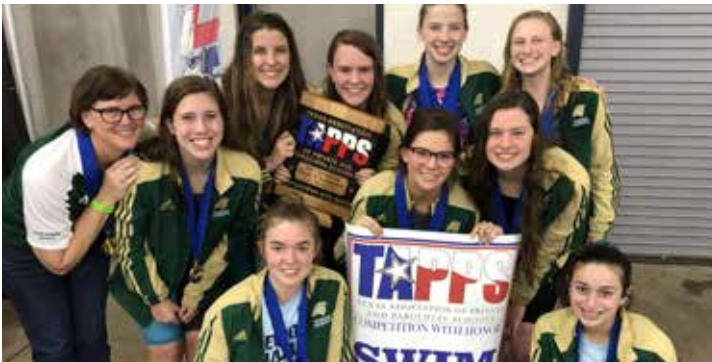

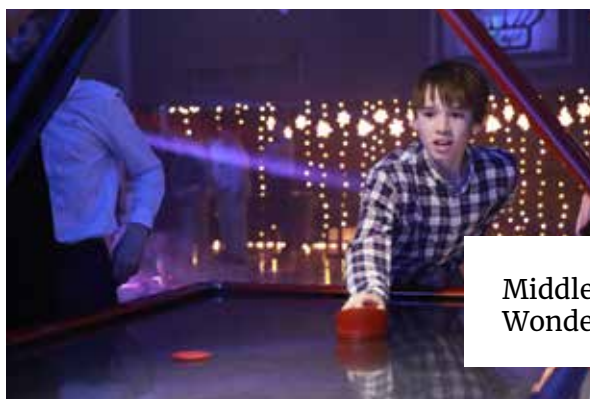

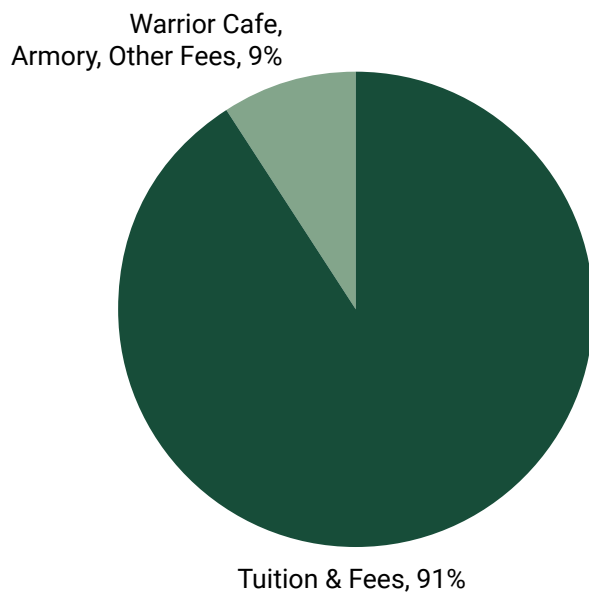
ALUMNI PROGRAM

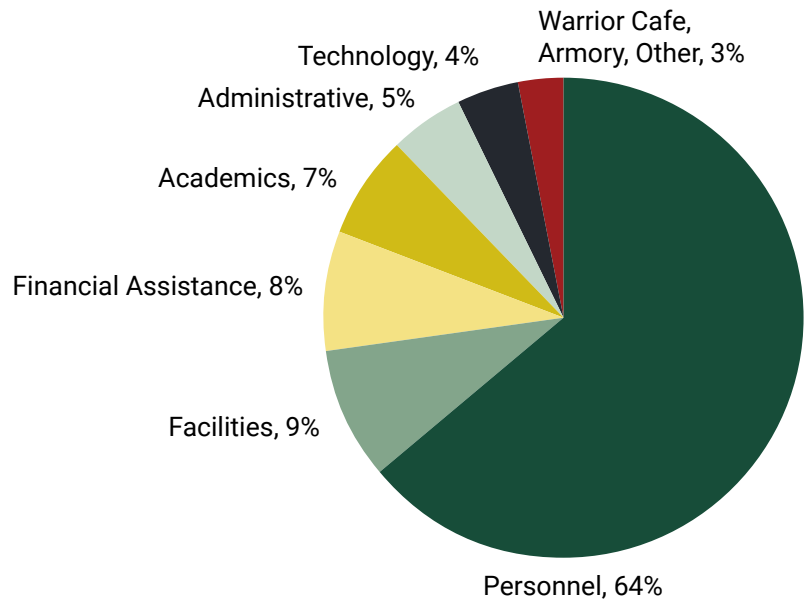
