On average 97 percent of seniors enroll in a two or four-year college following graduation. Hoban is committed to making Catholic education available to an economically, academically and ethnically diverse student population. The Brothers of Holy Cross founded the school in 1953 to serve boys from grades 9 through 12. In 1973, the school became coed. In 1976, the lay Board of Directors assumed major governance responsibilities. The Board continues to work with the Brothers, who now sponsor the school.

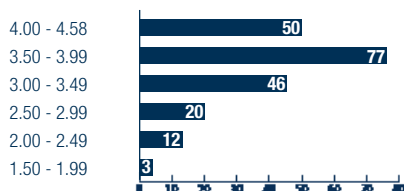
