

ABOUT WOODLAND SCHOOL

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Located just west of 280 at Alpine Road, Woodland is an independent day school that offers a balanced approach to learning in a diverse and inclusive environment for approximately 275 students in Preschool through Eighth Grade.

Woodland's Preschool-Eighth Grade environment embraces a whole-student approach to teaching and learning; empowering students to create, connect, and contribute with confidence while developing a strong sense of self and purpose in the world.

OUR GRADUATES

Woodland School is located on 10.5 acres. Our spacious and pastoral environment gives children room to breathe, space to play, and freedom to explore the environment around them--all beneficial to their social, emotional, and cognitive growth.

Children ages 3-5 learn and grow together in our mixedage environment. Older children display leadership skills, showing respect and compassion for younger children. Younger children learn from and and emulate their older mentors. We deeply value the social, emotional, and cognitive learning that children experience when they are grouped in a mixed aged, family-like setting.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION - PRESCHOOL AND PREKINDERGARTEN

BUILDING CREATIVE, COMPASSIONATE, CRITICAL THINKERS

Young children are naturally curious about the world around them, and everything we do within the Early Childhood Center helps foster each child's innate inquisitiveness. Project based learning, grounded by a deep appreciation for child centered emergent curriculum, guides our philosophical approach to instruction. Our talented educators deepen each child's sense of wonder, as students engage in rich, meaningful, and relevant units of study. Over the course of 6 to 8 weeks, students become experts in topics through the use of authentic materials. intentional read alouds, and contextualized learning experiences. Our robust curriculum supports kinesthetic, auditory, visual, and tactile learners, built upon a developmentally appropriate framework. Through these learning experiences, we hope to prepare a generation of children to become creative, compassionate, critical thinkers in today's ever changing world.

VALUING OUR FAMILIES

We understand that, for many children, their time in the Early Childhood Center is their first opportunity to join a school family, and we strive to make the experience both joyful and memorable. We strongly believe in the importance of positive relationships and partner closely with our families to support the needs of each child.

THE BEST EDUCATION, SUPPORTED BY THE BEST TECHNOLOGY

Throughout the day, our students participate in a variety of thoughtfully curated experiences, each constructed to support their social emotional, physical, literacy, language, cognitive, and mathematical development. Our educators leverage Teaching Strategies GOLD®, an early childhood digital portfolio system, to collect observations of student work and intentionally scaffold learning opportunities. Daily small group instruction allows teachers and children to connect through purposefully differentiated activities. As children work in Interest Areas, they engage in hands on intentional play, constructed to prepare every learner for Kindergarten.

WORLD CLASS LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

Our beautiful preschool classrooms are structured to offer children spaces where they can work independently, in small groups, and in larger groups of peers. Art, Blocks, Toys and Games, Sand and Water, Dramatic Play, Library, and Discovery learning areas are available daily and are intentionally prepared with provocations to invoke a sense of wonder. The learning continues outdoors, with the availability of tricycles, scooters, painting materials, blocks, and sand and water play.

K-4 LEARNING

A Whole-Student Approach

FINDING THEIR VOICES

Every child is unique. Our teachers team with parents to nurture and guide students to take ownership of their learning. Through this process, our students discover their strengths, face their challenges, and find their voice.

Beginning in Kindergarten, students experience personal growth by learning to take risks in a safe environment. With teacher guidance, students lead and present in morning assemblies to an audience of their peers.

STRONG FOUNDATIONS

Our students build a strong foundation of reading, writing, and mathematics and master key skills across disciplines to become adept learners. Instruction at Woodland School uses multi-sensory learning that is hands-on, rigorous, engaging, playful, and accessible to all learners.

Lower School Humanities builds fundamental skills in phonics, grammar, writing, reading, and social studies through an integrated and thematic approach.

The Lower School Mathematics program inspires and enables students to become whole brain

thinkers as they discover and develop their mathematical confidence and ability.



INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION

Woodland teachers are passionate about their commitment to deliver a learning experience that honors our students' individual strengths and abilities.

Ongoing assessment of student reading and math competencies begins in Kindergarten, allowing teachers to design lessons, projects, and small group instruction according to ability, interest, and skill.





LEARNING IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

In addition to strong academics, the middle school curriculum is designed to provide the skills students will need to make their way in our interconnected world: the ability to adapt to unfamiliar situations, find answers when not readily apparent, and become independent learners and flexible problem solvers who can think critically, collaborate effectively, manage their time, and live ethically.

ADVISORY PROGRAM: BUILDING RESILIENCE

The Advisory Program is designed to equip students with the self-knowledge necessary to develop their strengths, focus on goals, and be responsible decision-makers. Concepts of metacognition, decision-making, executive function, self-management, and personal advocacy are explored in a small group environment that is rooted in compassion, empathy, and awareness.

HUMANITIES AND CAPSTONE PROJECT

Through a combined discipline of Social Studies and English Language Arts, Humanities courses allow students to explore topics deeply and engage in investigations and projects.

At the start of Eighth Grade, students identify an issue of global or local significance that they are curious about and create an interdisciplinary project to raise awareness and make a difference in the world around them. These Capstone projects mark the culmination of middle school and prepare students for more indepth research in high school and beyond.

SCI-CON

Sci-Con is an annual, all-community event and celebration of the science research, collaborations, labs, and projects that students learn throughout the year. Interactive presentations by students and experts from the fields of science, technology, engineering, and math take the form of lab experiments, discussions, displays, and models. Recent Sci-Con topics include: Alternative Energy Sources, California Ecosystems, Photosynthesis and Respiration Labs, and DIY Acoustic Instruments.

INNOVATION LAB

The principles of design thinking and computer science are woven into the technology program at Woodland School. Students go through the iterative process of identifying a problem, designing, executing, and refining a solution. Students expand their aptitude to include robotics, programming, 3-D CAD modeling, and fabrication.

MATH AND ABSTRACT THINKING

Emphasizing problem-solving skills at each grade level, the middle school math program supports students' individual development as they grow into abstract thinkers. Our math program offers two levels per grade, allowing students to follow their own developmental timetable based on their readiness for abstract mathematical concepts.
