Location: SMA High School campus. The chairman called the meeting to order at 2:32 pm.

Motion to Approve the Minutes from the 25 October 2018 meeting:

COL Ben Knisely motioned for approval of the 25 October, 2018 minutes; Vice Chairman F. Steven Herb seconded the motion and the board unanimously approved.

Chairman Report: Chairman Herb Jones stated the importance of discussing and finalizing a Strategic Plan. He mentioned SMA-COL Christina Bowman has compiled a rough draft and inquired to the board if there are any changes or additional items to be included. The board discussed the inclusion of a future elementary school to the Strategic Plan in which the board concluded that at this time, an elementary school can be part of a ten to fifteen year plan that may be in conjunction with another existing school.

Vice Chairman Herb stated that a distinction of our vision and the Strategic Plan must be created. Dr. Tom McElheny explained that a vision should be grand with one to three sentences describing where we are going as an Academy. He further explained goals should be broken up to one to three years, three to five years, five to seven years with an academy wide dream goal over seven years.

SMA-COL Bowman discussed her vision of an elementary school in ten years and the enrollment numbers increase for next year. She explained her concerns with the high school campus remaining at the downtown location and the missed opportunity for enrollment within the increased growth out east. SMA-LTC Fred Fout further expressed concerns with the limited space to expand our campus and the current conditions sports and military teams play and fight for space to conduct practices and games. Ms. Carter Donovan agreed with their concerns in stating that the high school has outgrown its current facility and that it needs to be placed as a short term goal.

The board further discussed how to differentiate between the Strategic Plan and the Vision Statement with short and long term goals. SMA-MAJ Steve Kok provided a rough cost analysis on the expansion of our current high school campus with an additional building and parking garage. He explained costs with the exclusion of any playing fields. SMA-MAJ Kok proposed a few suggestions with a cost breakdown of campus locations. Chairman Crowell stated this location may not be satisfactory for the future and the need to create a structure that will support our vision. Chairman Jones agreed by stating that no more building will be done at the downtown location. SMA-LTC Fout assured that programs will be maintained and fostered until our long term vision can be supported.

Ms. Carter Donovan motioned to commit and proceed to establish relocating our facility to support our long term vision and mission; COL Ben Knisely seconded the motion and the board unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Herb stated the motion should be cited within the Strategic Plan. Dr. McElheny stated the Strategic Plan Committee should define phase one of the vision and constructively put phase two together. SMA-COL Bowman stated she will set up the next Strategic Plan Committee meeting.

Executive Director of School Report:

SMA-COL Christina Bowman updated the Board on Max Nevelus and discussed the therapists and therapy dogs that were present to assist our cadets and staff with the grieving process. She commended our leadership team and their ability to bring our school together during this difficult time.

SMA-COL Bowman mentioned the schedule of events for the Veterans Day Parade on the 11th of November and the Military Ball on the 17th of November.

Treasurer's Report: SMA-MAJ Steve Kok provided a read-ahead report. He discussed the financials for September. Vice Chairman Herb motioned to approve financials provided; COL Knisely seconded the motion and the board unanimously approved.

SMAP ATHLETICS REPORT 12-13-2018

<u>Girls Basketball</u> – The girls finished their season 0-7. Coach Mariah Williams knew this was a rebuilding year and spent a lot of time focusing on fundamentals and recruiting young players that she can develop for the future. We are anticipating great things for next year.

Boys Basketball – The boys finished their season 2 – 5. They did not make the playoffs. Coach Jim Smith related that the team played their absolute best in the last game and gave it their all. Coach Smith would like to institute a year round basketball program to promote greater conditioning and skill work. We are planning to look at the schedule to see if this is feasible.

<u>Soccer Club</u> – 41 boys and girls are participating in the soccer club which will run through December 18^{th} . Coach Hermann is working on soccer skills, drills and strategies that will assist these players during try outs for the team which will be held on January 9^{th} and 10^{th} .

<u>Cross Country</u> – The team will participate in the FSCL Championship on December 12th at Nathan Benderson Park. Coach Trecartin is anticipating strong finishes from all her runners. We will update you the results from the championship at the next meeting.

The <u>Wrestling</u> team had its first practice on 12/4. Approximately 25 students came out for the team. Coach Browning is finalizing the schedule for this season.

The Prep Athletic Awards ceremony will be held December 18th in the cafeteria at 3:40. The first semester sports of Volleyball, Flag Football, Cross Country, and Boys & Girls Basketball will present their athletes with certificates and an award will be presented to each sports MVP or MI.

*Club setting is a non-competitive environment where all cadets are encouraged to attend/participate. There is no tryout process. Each club provides an opportunity for cadets to showcase their talents, hone their skills, and build positive peer relationships. Clubs are DIFFERENT than out competitive athletic teams.

IB MYP Read Ahead - 12/13/18 SMA-MAJ Lisa Currie

It is important to clarify that IB alone does not define SMA but it is the combination of the foundational military values and structure blended with the IB mission and framework that further set SMA apart nationally. Best practices already embedded in the IB framework offer a guided streamlining of approaches to teaching and learning between the two campuses. It would be at that level of cohesion where the SMA 6th-12th educational experience would truly be second to none. There would simply be no other school that could compare.

As a strategic plan for SMA is currently in development, it is relevant to revisit the growing, positive impact of SMA as an authorized IB World School both at prep and the high school. The IB Middle Years Program (IB MYP) continues to gain mainstream awareness from parents (who want to be in the know) that are seeking the best middle school experience for their learners. The MYP allows for all learners to reach their potential and develops its value through creative implementation in all aspects of the learning process.

Enrollment survey respondents are "very interested" in the IB MYP above other unique aspects of our school. Collecting this information reveals awareness among prospective families seeking the quality and continuity of the IB MYP that other middle schools do not provide. Enrollment and retention continue to strengthen through word of mouth and social media. When an effective marketing strategy is fully implemented, the IB MYP will be an obvious stand out among middle schools.

Two SMA Prep educators received grants for \$1,000 each from the Florida League of IB Schools (FLIBS):

- SMA-MAJ Todd Brown (8th-grade Civics) <u>Project Health: Ninja</u> Student/parent/faculty collaboration to build an American Ninja Warrior obstacle course enhancing both short and long-term social/emotional learning, academic performance, and physical health obstacle course.
- SMA-CPT Deanne Ferguson (6th & 7th-grade Individuals & Societies) <u>More Than Words:</u>
 <u>Legacy Project</u>: Students will explore the lives and legacies of global thinkers, leaders, and innovators through identifying the ways these figures employed IB learner profile styles.

The IB Learner Profile of the Month Program was kick-started in October refining the cadet of the month to focus on the attributes of an IB Learner. Six cadets receive recognition each month. Cadets receive a certificate, recognition on our SMA website and SMA Prep Facebook. They will also be receiving a uniform ribbon and an extra polo dress day. Here is an example of the meaningful recognition students receive from teachers:

 "Lucas is new to our country from Brazil and shows his Open-Mindedness every day as many things are different in the US. For example, Brazilians write their numbers differently. Lucas speaks Portuguese and English and often explains to his classmates about life in Brazil."

IB Community Project is recognized by Keeping Sarasota County Beautiful **and awarded the** "School Excellence" award. SMA Cadet-MAJ Thomas Canales led a group of cadets to organize and participate in a beach clean-up on South Lido Beach. The IB Community Project is meant to build a culture of service in our learning community and is a requirement of our 8th-grade cadets. The goal is to develop "soft skills", leadership, and entrepreneurial insights developing and reflecting upon real-world service learning initiatives that are student-directed.

- e) The FHSAA (governing body over State Athletics) will be making changes to mandatory scheduling of games and team in our districts this year. The SAT test is untimed for the school-based administration only. It may not be used for college admissions but may be used as a concordant score in place of the FSA score for high school graduation. There will be a fall and a spring administration of the SAT and the FSA-ELA. The fall administration of the SAT yielded a 68% pass rate for the cadets that have not passed the FSA-ELA, meeting the high school graduation concordant score for those students.

AdvancED Update

SMA administrative teams are meeting at Prep and the high school to conduct a review of Leadership, Learning, and Resources. An Executive Report will be completed by the SMA team and uploaded into the AdvancED e-Prove system for advance review by the six-person team by the deadline of January 28th, 2019.
