The following explains how the School District of Haverford Township communicates with you in the event of a school closing, delayed opening or early dismissal, and how to opt-in to receive text messages.

We will run a test of the system on Thursday evening, October 17, 2019 beginning at 7:00 p.m.

HOW WE COMMUNICATE

When the School District needs to close or delay opening or dismiss early we will communicate this message in multiple ways:

Using the contact information we have in District Notification System (SchoolMessenger), we will send emails, phone calls and text messages to
parents/guardians, faculty and staff. We do not usually activate the system to call after 10:00 PM or before 5:30 AM. If a decision is made between
those hours, it will be posted on the district website.

We will run a test of the messaging system on Thursday evening, October 17, 2019, at 7 p.m. You should receive phone calls, text messages, and emails, which will say that it is a TEST message. You will not receive a text message if you have not opted-in to receive them.

TEXT MESSAGE OPT-IN DIRECTIONS

In order to receive text messages from our system, we must have your cell phone number in PowerSchool, and you must opt-in. If you received text messages from your school last year, you are in the system and do not need to do anything.

If you have not opted-in either this year or in previous years and want to receive texts from us, follow these instructions:

To opt-in, text the word YES to 68453. You should receive a reply that says, "You're registered 4 SchoolMessenger notifications. Reply STOP to cancel, HELP for help. Msg&data rates may apply. Msg freq varies. If you are not sure whether you have opted-in, text YES to 68453.

If you text YES to 68453 before Thursday night, and you receive a text during the test, you are opted in and do not need to do anything.

If you text YES to 68453 before the test and do NOT receive a text message, it may be because we do not have your cell phone number in our system.

Please contact your building secretary with your cell phone number(s) and note which parent/guardian the cell phone number belongs to.

Users may opt in to the system at any time during the year.

You can also find School Closing information and delayed opening schedules on our website. If you have questions about the School District's message system or your contact information, please contact your building secretary.

This event is for senior families with students entering post-secondary institutions in Fall 2020. Naviance helps students to identify their interests, research careers and colleges, and maintain a list of prospective colleges. Students will also use Naviance to complete assessments and perform tasks in preparation for career readiness.

9th Grade:

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, Counselors will be visiting 9th grade homerooms to introduce and provide an overview of Naviance and its capabilities in supporting student's post high school plans.

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, students will be completing the "Do What You Are" assessment in Naviance. This Personality Type assessment provides useful information about an individual's personal characteristics, careers that match those personal characteristics, personal strengths and blind spots, and more.

This month as part of Haverford's PA Career Readiness Plan, students will be completing the Career Key assessment in Naviance. This assessment is based on John Holland's theory of vocational choice. It suggests that most people are one of six personality types: realistic, investigative, artistic, social, enterprising and conventional and that people who choose to work in an environment similar to their personality type are more likely to be successful and satisfied. This assessment provides personality type and compatible work environments.

All 11th-grade students are required by the State to turn in a completed medical exam form from


your child's doctor. This is a reminder to have this completed or a plan to complete by the first day of school. Please turn all forms into the School
