# **CHAMBER ORCHESTRA**

Chamber Orchestra is available, by audition, to students, grades 9 - 12, who have exceeded Fairfield Skill Level VII and are current members of Concert or Symphonic Orchestra. Students taking this class will work individually and collaboratively to refine ensemble rehearsal and performance techniques, advanced instrumental techniques, music literacy and musicianship. Literature for this class will be selected from advanced string music from Baroque to Contemporary. Enrollment is limited and determined by balanced instrumentation in the ensemble. Chamber Orchestra meets one evening per week for two hours with sectional rehearsals to be determined.

Participation in all scheduled rehearsals, concerts and other performing events as listed in the Orchestra Handbook is required. Adherence to department policies including the Code of Ethics and performance dress code is also required.
