AN INVESTMENT IN EXCELLENCE

A very ambitious Annual Fund goal was put forward for our 70th anniversary year: \$350,000. We came close to meeting our goal, raising just over \$325,000 and increasing our total from the previous year (2017-2018) by \$48,486.

We couldn't be more grateful for the overwhelming generosity of the Stevens community. With the School just recently reaching full capacity in enrollment and auxiliary activities, the Annual Fund will now play an even more crucial role in maintaining our elevated standards of learning – to expand programs, retain faculty, incorporate new technology and increase our space.

2018-2019 HIGHLIGHTS

PROGRESSIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING

Hiring a new dedicated Middle School Learning Specialist. The addition of a new dedicated Middle School Learning Specialist to our current learning specialist staff will enable us to better support our students' varied learning needs.

COMMUNITY

Commitment to a safe learning environment. We will be helping students and families to better define bullying vs. non-bullying and increasing our efforts to create a safe learning environment free of harassment, intimidation and bullying.

Parent workshops on technology habits and recommendations. Based on family feedback, we will be conducting workshops and coffees on best practices and recommendations regarding student technology usage and family oversight.

DIVERSITY AND EQUITY

Culture and climate survey action plan. Results of our AIM (Assessment of Inclusion and Multiculturalism) Survey have been analyzed with the Leadership Team and Equity Coordinator, Hardevi Vyas. We are now finalizing our action plans and goals to ensure

Stevens continues to be a school where everyone feels included and has a sense of belonging. We will present our ideas to the School community this fall.

Addressing stereotyping. By encouraging and enabling our faculty to participate in several professional development opportunities on the subject, we have further empowered our staff with preventative and responsive practices for addressing stereotyping, stereotype threat, implicit bias and micro-aggressions. These will be integrated into our already extensive programming.

Profound diversity, equity and inclusion work. Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Expert, Sara Wicht, will be working with a cohort of faculty and staff throughout the coming year to:

- Provide anti-bias education
- Develop a culturally responsive pedagogy
- Explore ideas related to identity, culture, bias, power and privilege
- Examine "safe spaces" and their role in creating an inclusive school climate
- Design a high-quality multicultural curriculum that goes further than "heroes and holidays" and deeper than "food and fabric"
- Explain the intersections of school discipline and school climate by challenging cohort members to critically examine their relationships with students
- Learn culturally competent methods for increasing family engagement and building relationships in the community

CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT AND INNOVATION

Preparing for our decennial accreditation.

Our self-study document is complete and has been sent out for review for our dual accreditation visit by NJAIS (New Jersey Association of Independent Schools) and Middle States Association that will take place November 5th – 8th.

River Street self-contained afterschool program. Our Hoboken afterschool program will now be self-contained at River Street for PreK and Kindergarteners. This will open the door for more student-centered, age-appropriate enrichment programs, and enable our youngest afterschool students to truly own their space.

Technology updates. All four Stevens locations supplemented their existing technological resources resulting in enhanced security measures for each building and ensuring our students and faculty have access to the most state-of-the-art learning technologies in their learning environments:

NEWPORT

- Updated 80% of wireless access points
- Re-worked entire network closet
- Added new switches to manage wireless network
- Added wiring and new security cameras
- Added new phone system
- Added door camera and door release to phone system

- Added 30 new Chromebooks for 3rd and 4th grade
- Added 20 new tablets
- Added four new charging/storage stations for laptops and Chromebooks

BLOOMFIELD STREET

- Created wireless network with three new access points
- Added wiring and security cameras
- Added wiring and a new phone system

RIVER STREET

- Updated 50% of wireless access points
- Added wiring and security cameras
- Added wiring and a new phone system
- Increased Internet speed from 15/3 to 300/30

GARDEN STREET

- Updated 33% of wireless access points
- Added wiring and security cameras
- Added wiring and a new phone system
- Re-wired and added new switches to network cabinet to better manage wireless network
- Added 40 new Chromebooks for 3rd and 4th grade
- Added 20 new tablets
- Added four new charging/storage stations for laptops and Chromebooks

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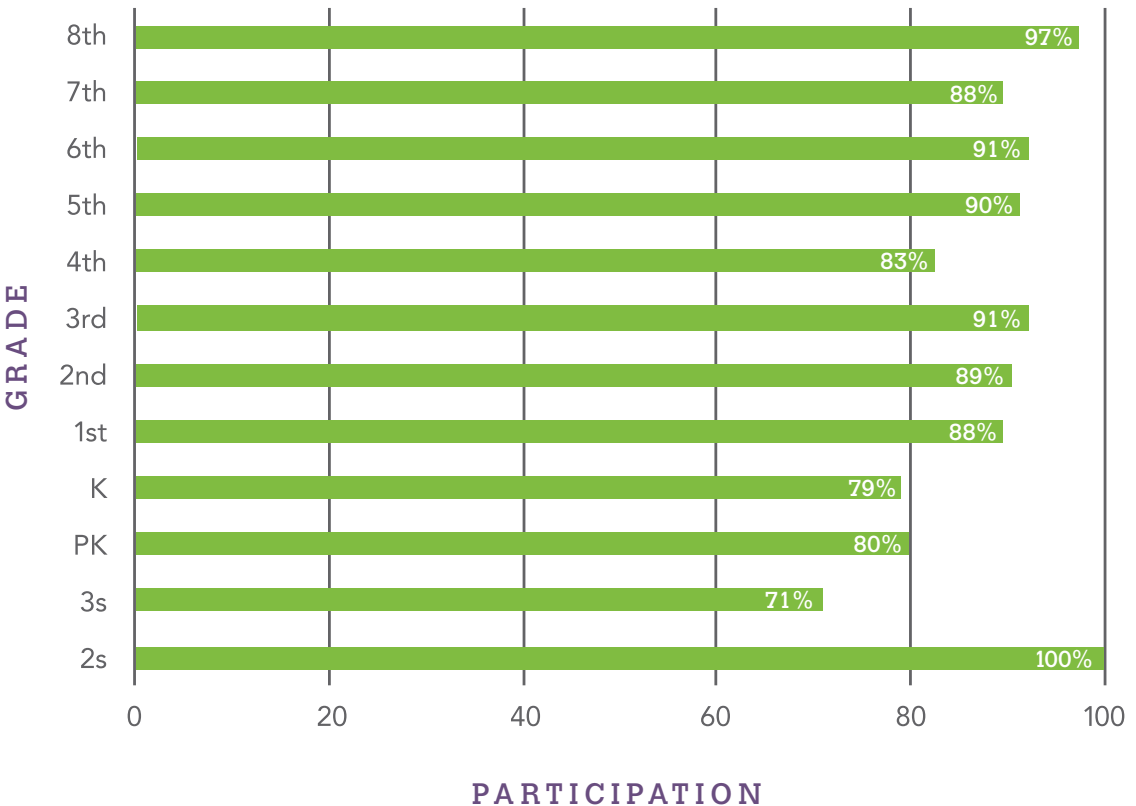

"I learned about the importance of making thinking visible through chalk talk, creating a culture of thinking right from the start, critical thinking dispositions that cultivate deep and enduring understanding, types of thinking moves that help students both retain what they learn and transfer it to new and unfamiliar contexts in math, how documentation can help empower struggling

learners to think metacognitively, how slow-looking routines can help students consider what's beyond their "attentional frame," and how to create opportunities where students see the need to try over and over again to get to the outcome they want." Joy and the other faculty members, Phoebe Westwood, Hardevi Vyas, and Shehla Ghouse (Newport principal) cannot wait to bring back these innovative strategies and ideas to share with students, colleagues and families at Stevens.
