- Make interdisciplinary connections
- Gain global competency

Curriculum:

<u>K-4</u>

• There is currently not a K-4 World Language curriculum or program

Grades 5-12

- The curriculum is textbook based
- There is inconsistent alignment to the NJSLS which were updated in 2014
- There are 6 different languages offered beginning in grade 7



Instruction:

- At the intermediate schools, 5th grade students only have Spanish class once a week; 6th graders have Spanish class twice a week
- Grades 7-12 World Language classes meet daily
- Teachers are working to ensure that they speak 80-90% in the target language and provide students many meaningful opportunities to use the language that they are studying
- There is in-class support available to Level 1 Spanish students at BRHS



Assessments:

- Variety of assessments used by teachers throughout the WL Program
 - Integrated Performance Assessments (IPA's)
 - Chapter tests
 - Speaking assessments
 - Writing assessments
- High School midterms & final exams are common across all levels and languages
- Teachers are in the process of creating common assessments
- The Department goal for 2018-2019 is to establish common assessments for each level of each language for the purpose of informing short-term and long term planning and/or measuring individual student growth. Assessment data will be well-organized



Resources:

- Most textbooks are outdated
- Supplemental materials vary from building to building
- Teachers seek out grants to purchase resources
- The language labs at BRHS and BRMS are integral to our World Language Program
- Teachers use technology such as Flipgrid, Skype and Edpuzzle to enhance the curriculum and embed 21st century skills in their lessons



Professional Development:

- Teachers receive in-district professional development specific to world languages at department meetings
- Online collaboration via World Language Department Google Classroom
- Teachers seek out professional development specific to world languages outside of BRRSD
- Grades 5-8 teachers find it difficult to collaborate as they don't have designated team meeting times
- Grades 9-12 teachers collaborate during preps and lunches



Student Success in World Languages

National Latin Exam

Every year, interested BRHS Latin students can take the National Latin Exam.

Students have been doing extremely well on this test.

In 2018, 124 students took the exam:

- 34 received Gold Summa Cum Laude recognition
- 33 received Silver Maxima Cum Laude
- 15 received Magna Cum Laude
- 10 received Cum Laude
- 13 received certificates or ribbons of merit.
- Additionally, 5 students earned perfect scores!

National French Exam

Every year, interested BRHS French students can take the National French Exam, Le Grand Concours.

Students have been doing extremely well on this test.

In 2018, 80 students took the exam.:

- 6 students won gold medals
- 23 students won silver medals
- 14 students won bronze medals
- 23 students won honorable mentions

Seal of Biliteracy Participation



BRHS seniors participated in the NJ Seal of Biliteracy for the first time in 2017-2018. There were 58 graduating seniors who earned the Seal demonstrating proficiency in English and another language!



Travel abroad opportunities



Bridgewater-Raritan High School has a partnership with Lycée de la Trinité school in Lyon, France. This exchange program runs biannually and allows our students to immerse themselves in the French language and culture during their 2 week stay in France. They also have the opportunity to continue their cultural experience when the French students come to NJ and stay with them for 1 week.



World Language Clubs & Honor Societies



BRRSD students can participate in many World Language clubs throughout our 5-12 Program.

BRHS Students in Level 3 or higher can also be inducted into a World Language Honor Society.

Students participate in many cultural activities. The clubs and honor societies also contribute to various charitable organizations, offer tutoring to students and participate in many BRRSD events!



Site Visits

Site visits were conducted by a BRRSD team including classroom teachers, supervisors and an assistant principal. Site visits occurred inside and outside of the county, as well as above and below our DFG. Other "I" school districts were researched but not visited. These districts include South Brunswick in Middlesex County, and Hunterdon Central in Hunterdon County.




Parent Survey Results (188 Responses)



Most respondents believe that the study of World Languages help their children with their other subjects. World Language classes do make many interdisciplinary connections.




Parent Survey Results (188 Responses)

Staff Survey Results (27 World Language teachers responded)


- Introduce Spanish to students in grades 3 and 4.
- Create curriculum that demonstrates how skills are built upon from one year to next.
 As students are introduced to concepts earlier, the curriculum will need to be adjusted to meet the students' needs.





- Introduce Spanish for Heritage Speakers at BRHS.
- Help build literacy skills of our heritage speakers in their native language which will help build literacy skills in English.






- Create consistency in the implementation of our curriculum districtwide.
- Align the curriculum to NJSLS 7.1
- Create grade level performance benchmarks because the world languages standard is benchmarked by proficiency levels.
- Align the curriculum with the ACTFL Can-Do Descriptors as well as the World-Readiness Standards

Curriculum Writing Recommendations

- Undergo articulation process as a department
- Write curricula for grades 3 and 4 Spanish courses
- Write curricula for BRHS Spanish Heritage course
- Revise and rewrite current 5-12 WL curricula (Modern Languages)
- Rename 7th & 8th grade to 1A & 1B and create a common curriculum with Level 1 at the HS



Assessment Recommendations



- Define standards-based Proficiency Benchmarks
- Create Common Interpretive, Interpersonal & Presentational Performance-Based Assessments and rubrics for each thematic unit.
- Create student checklists for each unit based on "Can-Do" descriptors
- Gather and analyze data



Resource Recommendations

- Supplement curriculum with authentic resources, readers, and online documents to provide differentiation
- Upgrade BRMS & BRHS Language Labs in order to embed 21st century skills in instruction and to provide students with an online platform for multilingual instruction



Professional Development Recommendations

- Provide professional development to support recommended initiatives
- Train staff in the use of Language Labs
- Provide common planning time to ensure collaboration and articulation
- Anchor training for grading of common assessments
- Encourage and support out of district professional development
