


THE LONGLIST

All longlisted books are available to borrow from the Library. Shortlisting will take place at the end of November and the winning book will be announced on World Book Day (March 2020).




ON THE COME UP - ANGIE THOMAS

BIRTHDAY - MEREDITH RUSSO





From the author of the hugely popular *One Of Us Is Lying*...


A perfect town is hiding secrets. Two teenagers are dead. Two murders unsolved. And a killer who claims to be coming back.


THE BURNING - LAURA BATES

NOWHERE ON EARTH - NICK LAKE




