President's Report



Closing the Gap Between Tuition and Actual Costs

There is a gap between private school tuition and the cost of educating students giving them a comprehensive academic and student life experience. The reality is that at Nazareth there is a gap between tuition and the cost of a Nazareth education. The annual tuition costs do not provide 100% of the costs involved in offering a quality Catholic education that strives to meet the needs of each and every student. Last year that gap was more than \$2,500 per student.

So how do schools meet the challenge of filling that gap? A strong fundraising program of individual giving from alumnae, current and alumnae parents and friends of Nazareth Academy!

Last year our strong fundraising program enabled us to meet unexpected and unbudgeted expenses that were nearly \$500,000. Due to successful fundraising, prudent decision making and strategic budget analysis, in May Nazareth had a projected surplus which allowed us to pay those bills plus:

- Upgrade of the Naz News equipment
- Purchase of a new sound system for the Student Dining Room
- Refinish the gym floor and before closing out the year, contract to address the dangerous and poor condition of the soccer and lacrosse field
- Purchase of new fire-rated doors

Over the last three years, the fundraising efforts of the Advancement Office along with strategic fiscal budgetary oversight has made an impact on the experience we are providing with projected surpluses that resulted in:

- Upgrading to interactive Smartboards
- Sending our chorale off to Carnegie Hall
- Replacing the homemade whiteboards with professional whiteboards
- Adding much needed positions such as Director of Academic Enrichment, Director of College Counseling, and an additional school counselor
- Publishing our first ever Viewbook to enhance our recruitment efforts
- Upgrading the website and publishing a video that captures the great things happening at Nazareth

Thank you to all the parents who respond to the Nazareth Fund appeal.

Thank you to those who supported the raffle and to those who are planning to attend our Taste of the Town on November 2nd.

We hope you will consider supporting these types of events and fundraisers to help make our school as great as it can possibly be!

Exams

Exams will take place from Tuesday, December 17th until Thursday, December 20th. I am attaching the schedule now (located on the next page) so that you may make necessary arrangements for this timeframe since the students are not in school for full days. Please note that no changes may be made to the existing examination schedule.

All classes that run for the entire academic year will administer Mid-Term exams during this period. Classes that run for one semester will administer Final exams during this period. For one semester classes, a Mid-Term exam may be given at the discretion of the teacher.

The only students who may receive an examination exemption are seniors who have maintained an A-/A for the mid-marking report and at the time of the final exam. For classes that run the entire year, a senior must earn an A-/A for every marking period. At the discretion of the teacher, advanced placement students need not sit for a final examination. All AP students must take the advanced placement exam administered by College Board.

This event will be held at the B&N store in the Neshaminy Mall from 5:30 until 9:00 p.m. Please mark this date on your calendars and come to see performances given by our chorus/chorale, guitar ensemble and dance team. Laying the Groundwork for the Future

The Counseling Department has been working with students in the Freshman class to create accounts on <u>Naviance</u>, <u>College Board</u> and <u>Khan Academy</u>.

During Freshman year, we are beginning to lay the groundwork for career and college exploration. These sites offer a variety of tools that will assist your child in career discovery, major discovery and college choice. We also encourage parents to visit and explore these websites to see what they have to offer.

Students who are currently enrolled in Freshman Counseling Seminar as well as Freshmen who are enrolled as Music Majors have been assisted by Counseling in linking their College Board and Khan Academy accounts. All other Freshmen, as well as transfer and/or international students will go through this same process at the start of the Spring Semester. However, if students would like to log on to these sites sooner, they are most welcome to see their School Counselor for assistance.

Challenge Day 2019-2020

Our Counseling Department is preparing for Nazareth Academy High School's first annual Challenge Day on Friday, November 22, 2019. The goal of Challenge Day is to empower our students to "Be the Change" they wish to see in our school and community. Challenge Day is a 4-hour counseling workshop, which includes activities that are designed to help students break down barriers so that they begin to see each other as human beings and perhaps not be so quick to judge by what's "on the outside." Counselors will facilitate powerful activities that elicit leadership, motivate students to reduce the acceptability of cliques, bullying, and oppression, and inspire them to create an environment of compassion, empathy, and respect in our school and community. Students who are interested in participating in this rewarding and inspiring day will be required to obtain a signature of permission by their teachers and parents.

HOBY

Applications for the Hugh O'Brian Youth (HOBY) Leadership Seminar will soon become available to all sophomores. The HOBY Leadership Seminar is a three-day conference that is a fun and interactive leadership training. This conference focuses on building and expanding leadership skills. The students will have the opportunity to stay on a college campus and explore leadership from three perspectives: individual, group and society. They will discover how leadership can lead to social change, and create relationships and bond with other sophomores from across the region. Participation in this seminar also reflects highly on a College Resume.
