## **Team 2220 Participation Contract**

## Code of conduct

"Gracious Professionalism" is essential to team participation. Disciplinary action, to be determined by team mentors in cooperation with the team advisor, may include suspension from team activities, ineligibility to travel with the team, or removal from the team.

- 1. Student will display "gracious professionalism" the motto of *FIRST* at times and promote the ideals of *FIRST*.
- 2. Students will **not** violate the **racial/religious/harassment/violence/and hazing** of the Minnesota State High School league (MSHL bylaws available upon request).
- 3. Students will follow the same rules as dictated by Eagan High School, including those in regards to alcohol and chemical substances.
- 4. Students are expected to behave in a **courteous and cooperative** manner.
- 5. Students are expected to be **respectful of others** and behave in a way that protects the health and safety of themselves and others.
- 6. Students shall be **respectful of the facilities**, tools equipment and all things being used by the team.
- 7. Students shall not use profane, obscene, or vulgar language in written, gestured or verbal form.
- 8. Students working at corporate sites are guests of the corporations and must be courteous and respectful. While at a corporate site, students are expected to follow the general rules and safety rules posted at the site.
- 9. Students are expected to keep current with team activities and requirements by checking the website and their email frequently.

## Student Eligibility

- Students must be in grades 9 12
- o Students must maintain at least a "C" grade point average.
- Students are expected to make a time commitment to the team, actively participate in meetings, workshops, and events, especially during the busy build season in January and February.

- i. **NOTE:** ONLY STUDENTS WHO HAVE MADE A SOLID COMMITMENT TO THE TEAM WILL BE ALLOWED TO TRAVEL TO THE COMPETITIONS.
- ii. NOTE II: Students who display a pattern of missing team sessions will be asked to leave the team. These unreliable students hurt the teams' performance. Missing two or more sessions without a reasonable excuse will risk their place on the team.
- Students are expected to be reliable (on time, prepared to work, clean up, positive attitude, assist newer members) and assist with team administrative tasks.
- 9<sup>th</sup> grade students are encouraged to choose between Lego Robotics and the Eagan Robotics Team (not both) during the same calendar year.
