

On November 5, White Bear Lake Area School District residents will vote whether to approve funding to address building needs across the district.

If voters approve the request, the bond funding would help:

- » provide space for our growing enrollment
- » address deferred maintenance and infrastructure needs

- » improve school safety and security
- » update classrooms for more flexible learning spaces

VOTE EARLY IN PERSON

Early voting locations and hours vary depending on whether you live in Ramsey, Washington or Anoka County. Visit www.isd624.org/Bond2019 to find out when and where you can vote early.

VOTE EARLY BY MAIL

Absentee ballot applications are available at all school offices or online at www.isd624.org/Bond2019.

Complete and submit an absentee ballot application for the county where you live, as noted on the back of the application. Once you submit the application, a ballot will be sent to you with instructions. Ballots must be received by Nov. 5.

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

Polls will be open on Nov. 5 from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Your polling location is determined by where you live and may be different from previous elections. Visit www.mnvotes.org or call 651-407-7563 to find your location.



Did you know?

 » A successful bond referendum would accommodate projected enrollment growth due to housing turnover and new construction happening throughout the district. *More than* 2,000 new resident students are expected during the next ten years, 25% higher than current capacity.

- » A successful bond referendum would impact *all of our buildings and students*.
- » *If the referendum is not approved*, the result would be overcrowded schools, higher class sizes, unmet security and maintenance needs, insufficient space for educational and community programs, and a continued "split" high school experience.
- » A successful referendum would address educational program and building maintenance needs to *maintain the community's investment in its schools*, as identified by a 90-member community-based planning committee.
 Voter Approved School Debt Tax Levy, Payable 2019, on a Home with an Est, Market Vision of CTED 000
- » Due to *sound fiscal management* and retiring existing debt, the comprehensive district-wide plan would result in a tax impact of only about \$23 per month for the average homeowner (\$275,000 value home).
- » Compared to neighboring districts, White Bear Lake Area Schools has the *lowest voter-approved school debt tax levy*.
