Dear Parents,

Halloween is near and I wanted to let you know our approach to it. Our Halloween assembly will occur on Thursday, October 31st at 3:00 p.m. This assembly is a Wilder tradition and gives our students the chance to get together and sing Halloween songs. All classes attend the assembly but it is at each teacher's discretion to have a classroom party.

Halloween has been a traditional "kids holiday" throughout the United States for generations. Many of us remember trick or treating around our neighborhoods when we were young. But, the emphasis on the event has grown significantly since our youth. There are many examples of the increased emphasis, such as movies, books, activities and events. At school, we down play most of the Halloween events, leaving it to you to participate in whatever manner you feel appropriate. Although costumes are not required, many of our students enjoy wearing costumes for their class party and school assembly. Costumes are NOT to emphasize violence; for example, NO WEAPONS or BLOOD-n-GORE or frightening masks. Also, fog machines or large amounts of dry ice will set off our smoke alarms, so we cannot use them during the festivities. Some grade levels will have students wear costumes to school and some will have time for students to change into costumes at school. Please be sure to check classroom newsletters for this information. Costumes may be worn on the bus, but props must be in a bag.

With such a rich and diverse population in our community, the staff members and I realize that many families have different beliefs and because of religious, personal or cultural reasons, some families do not wish to be involved in Halloween activities. Our librarian, Ms. Teachout, will be available to supervise students in the library who opt not to participate. They can take in classroom work or read.
