Study Skills for the Week in 4th & 5th Grades -Summarizing

Summarizing is a great tool for keeping your study time short and maximizing your learning. By writing down brief summaries of what you read, you won't have to read the same text as many times, and the important details will stick in your head faster. But this only works if your summaries are strong and include all of the important information. This week, students will be evaluating summaries to determine which ones give the most complete picture of what a text is about. You can practice at home by summarizing all sorts of things! Summarize a movie or TV show that you watched, or even summarize your whole weekend. Be sure to include all of the important details and none of the unimportant ones! You can practice as a family too...have one family member summarize a movie or TV show, then have another family member summarize the same movie or show. Compare your summaries. Did either person include something unimportant? Did either person skip something that was important? Practice summarizing any chance you get!

Changes to the ACT

Beginning with the September 2020 national ACT test date, students will have more options when taking the ACT:

- ACT Section Retest—Students who have already completed a full ACT test can choose to **retake one or more sections** (English, math, reading, science, or writing) without having to retake the entire test.
- <u>Superscore reporting</u>—To support the growing trend of students taking the ACT test multiple times, **score reports will now include a calculated ACT Superscore**, along with an ACT Composite score.
- Faster results with online testing—Students will be able to choose to take the ACT online at a test center on national ACT test dates and get their multiple-choice test results as early as two business days after taking the test.
