School uniform—middle school

In our continued commitment to raise standards, it is essential that Ysgol Nantgwyn continues to develop a culture of high expectations and instil a consistent sense of pride amongst all pupils. I am writing to confirm the uniform expectations for all pupils at Ysgol Nantgwyn for September 2019. Please also note that the Summer Uniform applies until October half term.

Minimum uniform expectation

- Royal blue or navy sweatshirt or cardigan**
- White or royal blue polo shirt
- Grey formal bottoms or dress trousers, skirt, pinafore or tartan skirt*
- Dark tights
- Black outdoor shoes

Dark colour coat

Optional uniform

All other parts of the school uniform are available for the middle school pupils and we would encourage pupils to move to the more formal uniform of white shirt and school tie, badged jumper and blazer, as they progress through middle school.

- Black or Navy shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings
- Royal blue or white t-shirt
- Optional royal blue quarter zip sweatshirt


*Summer uniform can include tailored grey shorts, summer gingham navy or blue dress, white badged polo shirt.

Reading at Ysgol Nantgwyn

At Ysgol Nantgwyn we are entirely committed to ensuring that, as a minimum expectation, all pupils are able to read at their chronological age. This is a core focus for all staff at the school as we know that when pupils are able to read in line with their chronological age, they are able to access all areas of the school curriculum and thrive in their learning. Over the course of the first year in Ysgol Nantgwyn a wide range of reading methods and interventions were implemented. These have been incredibly successful with many more pupils reading at their chronological age this September compared to September 2018. We have invested in Group Guided Reading for the Lower School so that pupils learn to take ownership for their reading and share the experience with their friends on a daily basis. In Gwyn Middle School we have invested over £1000 in new reading materials and appointed library monitors to create a positive reading culture that will stay with pupils throughout their education. In Nant, we have heavily invested in young adult fiction for the Library Resource Centre which is now opened and manned every lunchtime for pupils. Upper School also now has a supply of reading materials that can be used during registration time, should a pupil not have their own reading book with them. Reading takes place for Upper School pupils every Friday in registration.

This is a fantastic start to developing a reading culture and you are able to support this development at home. This infographic shows what an impact just 20 minutes of reading a day has on academic achievements.



Homework

Ysgol Nantgywn staff have been working to develop a revised homework policy across the school. The new policy is based on literacy, numeracy and the development of essential skills. At Ysgol Nantgwyn, homework activities are an important part of our home/school partnership and all pupils are expected to take part in a variety of homework tasks to enhance and support both their work in class and their progress in school. The homework will develop interest and engage pupils, as well as providing them with practise that they need to become secure in their learning and development of everyday skills. We would very much appreciate your support in encouraging your child to complete all homework set.

Middle school (Years 4, 5 and 6)

- •Reading Each teacher will provide at least one reading book per week for pupils to read. The day provided is based on the reading groups and the class teacher will inform parents of the relevant days. This will be published and shared on a regular basis. If a pupil finishes the book, then they are encouraged to bring the book back in and obtain a new one. There is no limit to reading!!
- •Spellings every Friday spelling tasks will provided to all pupils. This should be handed back in the following week.
- •Half termly homework menus Each half term pupils will be provided with a homework book/folder and suggested homework tasks to develop everyday skills, such as budgeting. Pupils will be expected to complete at least three of the homework tasks over a half term and record this in their homework books/folders to discuss with their class teacher.
- •Subject specific homework Pupils will be provided with one piece of homework in specific subject per half term. For example one piece of Science homework that links to the topic being studied in lessons.

Middle School (Years 7 and 8)

- •Reading Pupils should be bringing their own reading book/materials in every day to read in form period. If they do not bring a book they will be provided with one to read in form period. At home, pupils should be encouraged to read for 20 minutes every day.
- •Spellings Caru Dysgu teachers will provide target spelling each week to all pupils.
- Half termly homework menus Each half term pupils will be provided with a homework

and suggested homework tasks to develop everyday skills, such as recycling and environmental issues. Pupils will be expected to complete at least three of the homework tasks over a half term and record this in their homework books to discuss with their Caru Dysgu teacher.

•Subject Specific homework — Pupils will be provided with one piece of homework once a fortnight for all subjects. Pupils will be provided with clear expectations and deadlines for all homework set.

We have a number of Christmas activities planned this year— final dates of these will come out to you shortly after half term.
