Dear East End Parents and Guardians,

"The students of today are the leaders of tomorrow."

This is a quote that has been a part of YES Prep since I started 11 years ago, and it resonates with me now more than it did when I started teaching. Through my journey as an educator I have been able to see that quote come to life a few times over, specifically at East End.

There are currently 5 staff members who I had the pleasure of teaching when I was at YES Prep Southeast. Some of them were in my class in my first year as a teacher and probably taught me more than I taught them. Two of them I taught twice, in 8^{th} grade and again in 11^{th} grade. One used to regularly beat me on the basketball court, and one did the same with a volleyball. These people were my students and are now the leaders in their classrooms with their own students.



All these former students and I have developed relationships that have been mutually impactful. I believe that education is about relationships, collaboration, and high expectations. It is through this lens that I saw all my students and worked to establish a relationship with them so that I could motivate, build trust, and encourage them to take risks in my classroom. Much like the quote that I started with, connections matter and there are relationships being formed and strengthened every day at East End. We are working hard to create the leaders of tomorrow.

The 5 staff members mentioned and I have a special connection and I am so proud of each of them and honored to be in this work with them and all the tremendous and hard-working staff members that make East End so special.

YES Prep Parent Portal

Our goal at YES Prep is to make sure every single one of our students is college-ready once they graduate. Each one of our students is unique and the area and level of support they may need can vary. Currently, families are able to see how their student is doing in school through different online applications: Hero for behavior updates, Home Access Center to check grades.

In order to facilitate access to student information, YES Prep is happy to announce the launch of the Family Portal. This portal is a first stop to accessing information that would otherwise require you to log in to multiple sites.

The new Family Portal is a user-friendly way for families to view important information -attendance, behavior, grades, etc.- and understand their student's progress. Color-coded flags and optional notifications will highlight areas of concern or accomplishments, and brief explanations are included to help families interpret their student's data.

Beginning Friday, October 4, families will also be able to communicate with teachers and school staff through in-app chat and email. Plus, the portal will feature live translation for more than 60 languages.


