The School

Founded in 1963, we are a parent governed, nonprofit, independent, coeducational day school with English as the principal language of instruction. IST is a full International Baccalaureate (IB) school, offering the Primary Years Programme (PYP) from Early Childhood (EC) to Grade 5, Middle Years Programme (MYP) from Grade 6 to Grade 10, and the IB Diploma (IBDP) for Grade 11 and 12.

Community

The International School of Tanganyika's (IST) community is as diverse as it is inclusive. The student body represents more than 25 nationalities. The school employs highly qualified teachers and support staff from all over the world to ensure quality education is consistently provided at IST.

Scholarships

Each year, IST offers a limited number of full IB Diploma scholarships to Tanzanian nationals who have performed outstandingly in their secondary school exams (CSEE). A limited number of partial scholarships (up to 30% of tuition) are available for families with a demonstrated financial need. IST is also a participant of the Beacon Scholarship Programme.


Co-curricular Activities


IST is a member of ISSEA (International Schools of Southern and Eastern Africa), a regional athletic and extra-curricular association with 8 members including: American International School of Johannesburg, American International School of Lusaka, Harare International School, International Community School of Addis Ababa, International School of Kenya, International School of Uganda, and American International School of Mozambique.


Student-athletes from IST participate in competitive events with other ISSEA schools each year in volleyball, track and field, football, basketball, swimming and STEM. ISSEA also promotes intercultural opportunities for students through band, choir, visual arts, and drama festivals. Member schools host events on a rotational basis and IST will host ISSEA Drama and Art in 2019-20.

There are also over sixty weekly after school activity options within the following categories: service, sports and physical activities, academic/support clubs, arts, science and technology, crafts and games, wellness, communication, and leadership.
