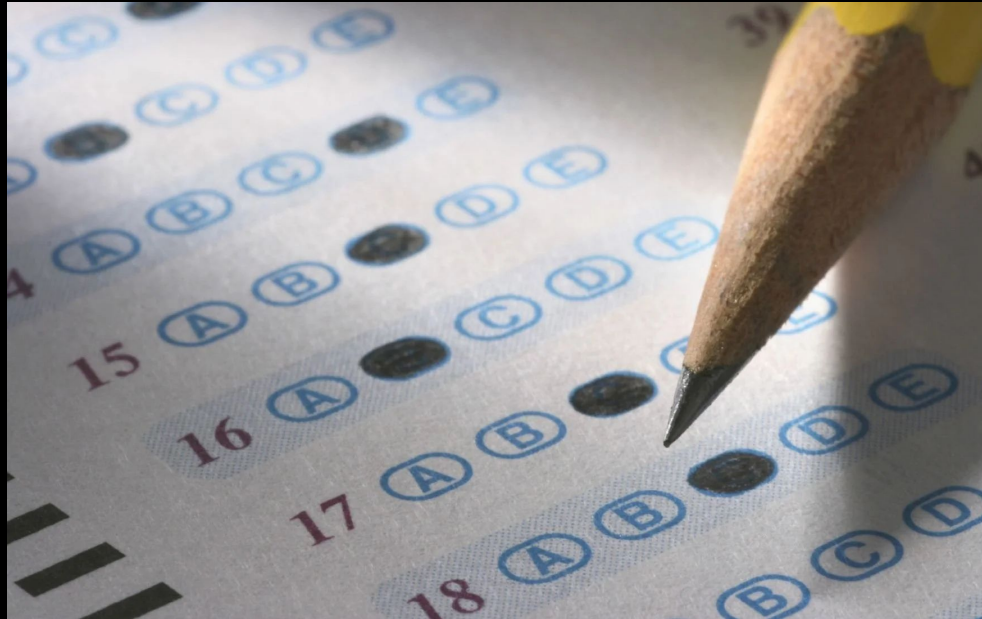

- Same test days as SAT
- Can take 3 on a test day
- Points off for wrong answers
