Veterans' Day

SFMS is in the planning stages for the annual Veterans Day Celebration. This will be the 19th annual celebration and a very special one. Because of the increased enrollment at SFMS, the event will be moved to the Don Coleman Coliseum, 1050 Dairy Ashford Road. The date for the celebration is the actual Veterans Day, Monday, November 11. The Veteran's breakfast will begin at 7:45 am, followed by the patriotic assembly at 9:15 am. We will be transporting all of the students to Don Coleman the morning of the event. It should be a very exciting day for our schools as we salute our community's veterans! As part of the event, we are once again going to do a fundraiser for our veterans-related charity, Patriot Paws. Patriot Paws, which has headquarters in Rockwall, TX, trains and provides service dogs to our veterans in need. The Patriot Paws Chapter at Texas A & M will once again be attending the event! Preparing for High School

Eighth-grade students will be asked to choose an endorsement, similar to a college major as it is an "area of interest" that students may pursue in high school. The five endorsement areas are Arts and Humanities, Business and Industry, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Public Service, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Students are able to earn more than one endorsement and change endorsement any time before their junior year. A pathway is a series of course options needed to earn a particular endorsement. There are several pathways within an endorsement.





Resume Sections

What's Included?

Resume Sections is where you begin building the various sections of the resume. The **Add Section** button (+ sign) is used to add desired sections.

Although there are many resume sections available, the most common are:

- Objective
- Summary
- Work Experience
- Education
- Extracurricular Activities
- Awards
- References

Adding Sections

The steps to create a section are:

- From Resume > Add/Update Sections, click Add Section (+ sign).
- 2. Click the **section** to include on the resume.



- 3. The section heading will provide a **tip** to assist you with understanding the purpose of that section. If the tip is long, use **More tips** to expand the tip.
- 4. Each section provides related fields of data to complete. Enter in the information as needed.
- 5. Use **ADD** to complete and add the section to the resume.
- Once an item is added, a new option displays to Add new information for that same section.

EXAMPLE: if you have had multiple jobs, you would use **Add New Work Experience** after entering your first job in the Work Experience Section to input your second job.

Use the Edit and Remove options in each section as needed.



Build the Resume

All the hard work has been completed – the sections are done! Now, it's time to build your resume.

Getting Started

- From the Resume page, click the Print/Export Resume tab.
- 2. Click the **Add** button (+).

The Add/Edit Saved Resume Step 1 displays – Set up Resume.








