

# What Does the Research Say?

#### Participation:


Students previously enrolled in the MYP were 34% more likely to take at least one AP or IB course in high school.

#### · Achievement:

MYP enrollment significantly increased the likelihood of achieving at least one "college-ready" score on a college preparatory exam (by 39%).

## What Does Greater Rigor Look Like?


#### IB is:

A framework that requires students to engage in meaningful, intellectual investigation

There is an emphasis on process not outcome,
Critical thinking not memorization
Practical application

A different or harder curriculum Exclusive to advanced students More work for the students An international curriculum





Learning how to learn

#### How does MYP address these unique opportunities?



- Direct instruction regarding habits-of-mind, self-analysis and reflectiveness
- Common goals, vision and vocabulary across disciplines
- Expectation and assessment of these efforts structured in curricula

## Learning how to Learn

'I think the IB is really good at teaching you how to learn...Everything that you do contributes towards - I don't know how to say it besides - learning how to learn. You know how to approach things even if it's something completely foreign to you...Learning how to learn comes first and the facts...are secondary.'

'I think the MYP opens your mind and keeps it open.' (Year 9 student)






