Why do we engage in outside testing?

There is a huge debate going on in both national and international education settings around testing. There is the polemic based on the amount of testing, which discusses whether there is too much or too little. Generally speaking, NIS takes the view that too much testing is a poor use of student and teacher time; however, we know that there is a need to strike the right balance. The most interesting debate is not about the amount of testing, but rather the reasons for using testing as part of a student evaluation structure. Teachers usually use testing to help students see where they are, so they can see where they are doing well or where they have challenges. At NIS, this is always based on a broader understanding of assessment and evaluation, which teachers use frequently, but it is one which many parents would not recognise as testing as it is not a traditional, written, summative exam.

Students and parents of Grades 3 - 10 have just received the results of the bi-annual MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) tests, or diagnostic assessments. These are incredibly helpful as they give normative feedback about where the student is performing in comparison with other children of their age around the world. More importantly, the MAP tests track their progress. Mr. Bratton will explain this in more detail at the parent coffee morning on Tuesday, November 19. The MAP data is helpful to teachers as well. They get a full breakdown of areas where students could improve and can tailor their teaching to individual and group needs. That's what we do in an inclusive school.

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Well done to 2019 SAT takers

Each year, we have between 15 – 20 students in Grades 10 & 11 that take the SAT tests as part of their applications to universities in the USA. NIS is a registered test centre. However, the students choosing to sit for the SATs self-select, as most of our students do not go to the USA to study. Therefore, the SATs are not relevant to some. Of the 16 students who took tests in 2019, seven scored a perfect score of 800 making these the highest SAT Maths results in NIS History. Well done to our students.

Exit Procedure

- 1. Once you know you are leaving please send an email to <u>admissions@nanjing-school.com</u> indicating your intention to leave and requesting any documentation that you may require. Let us have the name of your child or children, their current grades as well as your expected leaving date.
- 2. Collect a clearance form from Reception, or download off the website.
- 3. Clearance forms need to be completed for each leaving student.
- 4. On the last day of school documents will only be handed over if we have received your completed clearance form.


