

Shepaug Valley School was completed in 1971 and designed to provide a quality education for the students of Bridgewater, Roxbury, and Washington, Connecticut and is also a school of choice for students in Sherman, Connecticut. Shepaug is a comprehensive public school grades 6-12 with an enrollment of 432 students, 272 of which are high school students, and 56 faculty members.

Commonly referred to as the Shepaug Experience, the learning community is known for rich and diverse programs, class sizes that maximize student engagement in intellectual pursuits, close relationships between teachers and students, and a reputation for excellence.



THE SHEPAUG EXPERIENCE

In order to uphold our Core Values and achieve our Learner Outcomes, Shepaug features a professionally equipped theater, an Olympic style swimming pool, and a well appointed technology and arts wing designed to introduce our students to a broad range of career, creative, and technological pursuits. The school provides state-of-the-art technology for student and teacher use. The library houses more than 12,500 print volumes, periodicals, and resource materials in a variety of media.

Beginning with the 2019 - 2020 school year, Shepaug students will also have the opportunity to participate in an agriscience program, focusing on such topics as equine, animal, and plant systems; power, structural and technical systems; and food production and processing, including sustainable food production.

SHEPAUG STUDENTS: ACTIVE AND INVOLVED

Model United Nations: Last year, students participated in the annual *Model United Nations* conference hosted by Harvard University. Students spent four days in Boston collaborating with over 3,000 students from 34 countries. Shepaug represented security council member Saudi Arabia, a tribute to the enthusiasm and long standing success of the club. In addition to General Assembly committees, several Shepaug students were accepted to highly competitive specialized committees.

Shepaug Musicians: Student musicians performed at a number of unique venues last school year. In addition to our winter and spring shows students participated in Berkshire League Music festival, the Northern Region Music Festival and the All-State Music Festival.

Shepaug Dramatics: Student actors earned 10 nominations for the prestigious Halo Awards. Two students took home distinguished awards for scenic design and Best Performance By a Leading Actress for *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*.

Shepaug Digital Media:

Six Shepaug students received scholarships at the Fox 61 News Awards. Students were awarded their scholarship money by Connecticut Secretary of State Denise W. Merrill. There were 107 schools that participated in the program. Shepaug won two of the six scholarship categories. In addition to the scholarship recipients, seven other students were nominated and showcased at the event.
