Apple Distinguished School - Rosehill Elementary School has also been recognized as an Apple Distinguished School for 2019-2022.


Rosehill Elementary where "The Future is Unlimited," has students serve as advisors to city officials and is home to transportation engineers, fashion designers, and award-
