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The History of The Bevevino Library By Connie Fleeger

The groundbreaking for the Mary Kintz Bevevino Library took place in April 1998. This event was a dream come true for Sr. Sharon Gallagher R.S.M., the director at that time. The nationally known architectural firm of Bohlin Cywinski Jackson, Wilkes-Barre, designed the building. The library is located at the heart of the campus. The Mary Kintz Bevevino Library was built in honor of a Misericordia alumna who devoted herself to her family, and who embraced a wide variety of community activities, serving wherever she was needed. Mary Bevevino passed away in October.

The ribbon cutting was performed by the Bevevino family at the Convocation Program August 27th, 1999. College Misericordia was honored to dedicate a plaque to the memory of Mary Kintz Bevevino,

and a beautiful oil portrait of Mary, painted by Hazelton area artist Robin Antolick Marchetti. The portrait and plaque have been placed on the first floor of the building to be seen upon entering. They stand in recognition of her devotion to learning, to the college and to the education of future Misericordia students.

The building contains three floors. The first floor contains a lobby, main circulation desk, video collection and offices for the library staff. The reference collection, periodicals, conference rooms and study space are on the second floor. The third floor houses the Catherine Evans McGowen Conference Center, study space, office space, the general collection, and the Sister Mary Carmel McGarigle, R.S.M. Archives.

The mission of the library is to provide informational and instructional support to the students, faculty and staff of College Misericordia. To this end, the library will provide a comprehensive program of resources, facilities and services consistent with the college's mission of providing quality academics, professional preparation and service leadership.

The Data Search Lab at the Library

The Data Search Lab is located on the second floor of the library. It has computer terminals that may be used to access the library's electronic databases as well as the Internet. It is equipped with two laser printers, and printing is free of charge.

Students, faculty, staff, and the general public are welcome to use the Lab. In fact, the Lab does experience a lot of usage from both students and the public throughout the year.

The Data Search Lab is also used for library instruction sessions. Faculty who bring their classes

over to the library for such hands-on instruction will be directed to the Lab where a 46" Plasma screen has been installed.

The library is proud to own this Plasma Screen which is a powerful tool for making clear and visually stimulating presentations. It is equipped to be used in conjunction with a laptop computer which, in turn, may be connected to the Internet. There is an option for audio input so students may be treated to both an audio and visual instruction session. Additionally, the Plasma Screen may also be attached to a DVD

or VCR player for a multi-media presentation.

Hours for the Data Search Lab are the same as the library hours, and during the regular semester (Fall and Spring), like the library, it is open late, till 11pm from Mon-Thurs, and on Sunday.


