

DE ANZA/FUHSD APPROVED COURSES TO MEET FUHSD, UC AND CSU REQUIREMENTS

TRANSFERABLE DE ANZA CLASSES

General Education (GE) courses you can complete at De Anza College are determined by which university you will attend – UC, CSU, private/out-of-state.

You need at least 90 transferable, quarter units (45 units/year) in order to Transfer.

UC

- To find UC a-g courses at De Anza go to

- General Education (GE) courses are listed on the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) list of De Anza courses.
- In most cases, De Anza courses numbered **1-49** are transferable:
 - i.e., MATH 10, BIOL 40A are UC transferable.
- Use **WWW.ASSIST.ORG** to find the De Anza courses within a specific major at an UC.
 - The courses can differ from one UC campus to the next.
- Courses in your major (even if they are numbered 1-49) are sometimes non-transferable because the UC would prefer that you take “major” courses at the UC.

CSU

- General Education (GE) courses are listed on the Breadth Requirements list of De Anza courses.
- In most cases, De Anza courses: numbered **1-99** are transferable:
 - i.e., ACCT 1A, HLTH 51 are CSU transferable.
- Use **WWW.ASSIST.ORG** to select the De Anza courses within a specific major at a CSU.
 - The courses can differ from one CSU campus to the next.
- Courses in your major (even if they are numbered 1-99) are sometimes non-transferable because the CSU would prefer that you take “major” courses at the CSU.

Private/Out-of-State

- Check the universities’ website if there is a listing of transferable courses.
- In most cases, De Anza courses numbered **1-49** are transferable:
 - i.e. MATH 10, BIOL 40A are transferable.

Look at the De Anza Transfer Center website at www.deanza.edu/transfer/ for an updated IGETC and CSU Breadth requirement lists – they do change each year.

PRE-REQUISITES

PRE-REQUISITES are Placement Tests and De Anza courses that must be completed **BEFORE** registration **EVERY** quarter.

To check if your desired course has any required PRE-REQUISITES:

- Look under SCHEDULE OF CLASSES on the De Anza website—<http://www.deanza.edu/schedule/>
- After you select the QUARTER & SUBJECT, you will see all of that SUBJECT'S COURSES.
- By selecting a COURSE, you can scroll down towards the bottom, but above the COURSE DESCRIPTION, you will find any REQUISITES.
- If a REQUISITE is listed, it is REQUIRED prior to registering for a course.
- **You cannot register for a course without completing the REQUISITES first.**
- If an ADVISORY is listed, it is only a suggestion (it is advice) and is NOT required.

If want to try to OVERRIDE A REQUISITE, you will need HARDCOPY PROOF.

To do an OVERRIDE**, follow the directions below for completing the *Pre-Requisite Clearance form*:

- You must complete the *Pre-Requisite Clearance form* found at <http://deanza.edu/admissions/evaluations/prerequisites.html>
- Attach an unofficial copy of your FUHSD transcript* or an unofficial college transcript AND a hardcopy of your qualifying AP scores to the *Pre-Requisite Clearance form*.
- FUHSD transcript okay to use when De Anza Course Description says “or equivalent”.
- Complete the form and send it to: daclearprereq@fhda.edu
- It takes approximately 3-5 days to clear you for the appropriate placement level; check to see it is done by looking at your De Anza student account in MyPortal – click on the REGISTRATION tab then go to “See my Placement Test Results” in the “My Records” rectangle.
- This process must be completed **BEFORE** registration **EVERY** quarter.

In addition, an unofficial high school **transcript** (no other hardcopy proof) & the *Pre-Requisite Clearance form* may be used to meet the “or equivalent” Pre-Requisite for the (3) following De Anza classes:

- MATH 212 = FUHSD Algebra 1 for **ECON 1 or 2**; MATH 114 = FUHSD Algebra 2 for **CHEM 1A**;
PHYS 50 = FUHSD Physics Honors for **PHYS 4A**

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) POLICY

The following chart shows which De Anza College courses you may be placed into based upon **Advanced Placement (AP)** exam scores:

In order for **placement**, **not credit**, based on your **AP** scores in subjects other than Computer Science (CIS) and World Languages, you must complete a **Pre-Requisite Clearance form**—see previous page.

Credit should only be given at the university you will attend unless you plan on earning an AA/AS degree at De Anza.

How to Register for a De Anza class

Make sure your De Anza student account is prepared BEFORE your registration date:

1. Log in to MyPortal (<https://myportal.fhda.edu/cp/home/displaylogin>) and click on the “Students” Tab.
2. Click on the “Get Date to Register” to check your registration date.
3. The HS Registration date is **always** the last possible date. The registration window will open at **8:00 AM**.
4. Look to see if you have any holds. Click “Back to Students tab” and then click the “View Holds” link.
5. There should NOT be any holds on your account. If there are holds (from the library or cashiering) then you will need to clear these before you can register for classes.
6. Check (and Update if necessary) your email address so that the MyPortal system can contact you regarding wait list movements, etc. Click on the “Update Personal Information” tab and then the “View Email Addresses” link. Make sure that the email they have on file is one that you check regularly, at least daily.
7. If you need to Update your Email address, in the “View Email Addresses” window, click on the “Update Email Addresses” link in the lower center of the screen. Follow the directions to update your email addresses.

BEFORE your registration date, prepare your schedule:

1. Look at the schedule of classes on the De Anza College website - <http://www.deanza.edu/schedule/>
2. Try to figure out the best schedule for your quarter, taking into account instructors and times of classes, and then write down **ALL** of the information for these classes on the provided worksheet, including **the CRNs**.
3. Remember that you will only be able to register for classes that are pre-authorized by your high school. That is, were listed on your High School Permission form. If the class was not on the form then you will not be able to try to add the course.
4. You may take **on average 2 classes** (worth approximately **11 total units**) during the school year and **only 1 class** (worth approximately **6 units**) in the summer quarter.
5. Have all of your information (especially **the CRNs**) ready when you log in to register at **8 AM**.

Register for Classes at 8 AM on your assigned registration date by logging into MyPortal

1. Click on the “Students” tab and then the “Add or Drop Classes” link.
2. Select the term (i.e., 2019 Fall De Anza) and submit. From here you should be able to add classes by entering their CRN numbers:
 - Enter the CRN numbers of the class(es) that you want most.
 - When you have entered all of the classes, click the “Submit Changes” button at the bottom left of the screen.
 - If you receive an error code because you have been placed on the waitlist, check your place on the wait list. If you would like to be wait listed, select “Waitlisted” in the pull down menu and then click on the “Submit Changes” button.
 - You may pay the fees for the classes at this time with a credit card.

Some things to remember:

1. You may only sign up for the classes you have been cleared to take/ were listed on your High School Permission form. Do not try to sign up for any others.
2. A general rule of thumb for waitlists: if you are listed in the top five, then you can remain there and your chances are good. Otherwise, try to find another class.
3. If you cannot be on a waitlist, you may still try to add the course on the first day of classes by attending the class; the professor will let you know at the beginning of class if he/she is adding any additional students.
4. If you are admitted into a class after the quarter begins, make sure to get an ADD CODE from the teacher; you will need to enter this code in order to actually register for the class; ADD CODES may only be obtained during the first 2 weeks of a quarter.
5. If you change your mind, do not forget to drop any classes. Failure to do so may result in an F on your permanent record.
