National Unified Champion School



Haverford High School, a Special Olympics Pennsylvania Unified Champion School, hosted a special banner presentation to acknowledge the School's national recognition for its outstanding efforts to provide inclusive sports and activities for students with and without disabilities. The celebration was held on Friday, November 8th.

The celebration featured cheering students, remarks from Matt Aaron, Special Olympics President & CEO, Carole Clancy, Director of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Pete Donaghy, Principal of Haverford High School, and students with intellectual disabilities (ID) who participate in the school's unified sports program. The remarks were followed by a "teachers vs. students" bocce game and the unveiling of the 2019 National Unified Champion School Banner.

More than 150 schools are currently participating in Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools programming in Pennsylvania and more than 5,000 schools across the country engaged in the program. The school is receiving this honor as a result of meeting national standards of excellence in the areas of inclusion, advocacy, and respect, which places it among a select number of schools to receive this distinction. The Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools model is supported by the Office of Special Education Programs at the U.S. Department of Education. 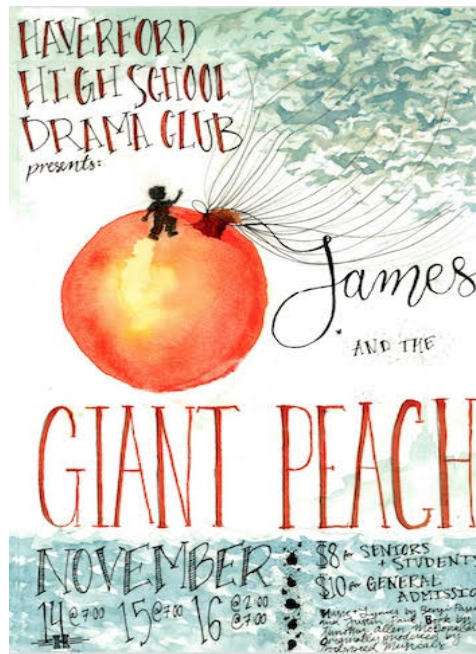

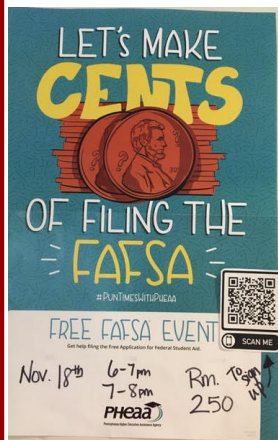

Please complete the AP Exam Registration form and turn in to Ms. Novino in the Counseling Office. No payments are due at this time. Per CollegeBoard, if you register for a test but withdraw from taking the test, a \$40.00 fee will be charged. If you need accommodations, you must complete an application and receive approval through CollegeBoard prior to the testing date. If you have accommodations, please provide your SSD code on the AP Exam registration form. AP Exam Registration forms can be found in the Counseling Office. Registration for 2nd Semester courses will be in January of 2020.

Financial Aid:

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and the CSS (College Scholarship Service) Profile both open on October 1st. Some schools require the CSS Profile (which can be found on the CollegeBoard website) in addition to the FAFSA. Each school has their own deadlines for required completion of these documents in order for students to be considered for federal, state and institutional aid.

The Haverford High School Counseling Department is sponsoring a **FAFSA Completion Night** on **Tuesday, November 18, 2019 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm**. This event is for senior families with students entering post-secondary institutions in Fall 2020. It will take place at Haverford High School in **Room 250**, and will be conducted by a representative from PHEAA (PA Higher Education Assistance Agency). - **2018 Federal Income Tax Returns**

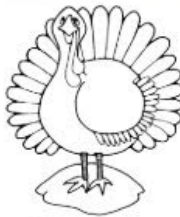

If you have been experiencing issues with the app, please follow the below steps.

The steps to perform this refresh are:

1. Open the SchoolMessenger app.
2. Go to the menu in the upper left corner.
3. Choose contacts.
4. Once in contacts, press the refresh button in the upper right-hand corner.
5. This screen will still show an error, but when you open the menu from the upper left the second time, you will have access to Attendance. Messages will also be populated with all recent messages you were sent.
6. At this point, your app should be functioning normally again.
