IV. Presentation:

Presenter: Sensei David Reicher co-founder of Martial Arts Therapy for Personal Protection for People with Disability

Program started in 1990 specifically in the field of Traumatic Brain Injury with goal and outcomes documented. The program was influenced by martial artist, physical therapist, speech / language pathologist, occupational therapist, recreational therapist, social worker, neuro psychologist and rehabilitation technicians.

The group questioned themselves on what the responsibility was if a person with a disability was taught techniques that could be considered violent. The team insured to incorporate behavior in their classes and to work to ensure that the what is taught can be used in everyday life and have yet to have anyone come forward and say that a student has caused a problem or become violent.

Group is only for people with disabilities and currently funded by the DMUM, Dance Marathon at the University of Michigan

So many participants can't go to a regular martial arts classes because of restrictions such as being barefoot or the site is not wheelchair accessible but the goals is to have the kids no longer need this martial arts therapy course but to move beyond this course. Th focus is, whenever possible, integration back into a "regular" martial arts class or into another activity within the community. Goal is have the kids leave the program.

The team believes the group works so well because it is centered around group activities but success is based on individual performance and effort.

What you do and how you practice is what you're going to use in real life so the focus is on teaching everyday skills.

A huge portion of the program is to teach awareness and self-awareness to the students with a focus on the student's movement patterns and movement competence.

One exercise is teaching to wait in line – so many students can't stand in line or step aside when someone else is coming or if they're in the way.

Classes have been running at Providence park for over 20 years.

David covered where the program runs out of, how it is funded, the quality and certification of staff and volunteers.

Current locations are at U of M Ann Arbor on Tuesday evening & Saturdays afternoons at Providence Hospital in Southfield
