## **Matt King**

Interim Superintendent Thomas introduced Matt King his coach from the Massachusetts New Superintendents' Induction Program. Matt was superintendent for 28 years: superintendent of the Wellesley Public Schools, superintendent/principal of Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School and superintendent/principal of the Carlisle Public Schools. He currently teaches in the Leadership Licensure Program.

Matt discussed his role and support to Interim Superintendent Thomas during the next two years. The Superintendent's Association is partnered with the State's Superintendent Association and Department of Education. There are 18 new superintendents that will participate in the program. Classes are held in Marlborough, MA and Mr. King meets regularly with Interim Superintendent Thomas at central for coaching one on one.

## October 1 Enrollment Report

School Registration & Parent Information Center Director Marcia Andrade-Serpa presented a power point to discuss the October 1 enrollment report:

Mr. Minichiello mentioned we have work to do in our district. Our district has suffered a great deal of impact the past six years due to the budget however he feels we are making some progress this year.

Executive Director of Assessment, Accountability, Technology Dr. Ethan Cancell mentioned although you can see the impact our budget has had we have to do better. Historically we have done better and the way we do better is by focusing on teaching and learning and the level of rigor.

Chief Academic Officer June Saba-Maguire addressed the key district initiatives that are in place. They are to look at our goals this year, and our expectations for students. Mr. Jon Saphier who works with Research for Better Teaching will work with all our schools this year. Mr. Saphier is attending the Curriculum subcommittee and School Committee on October 29, 2019 to present some of the work that will be done with all our schools. Cohort 1 is comprised of all turnaround schools, there is a cohort of teachers and administrators who will attend this professional development titled "High Expectations Teaching", by the end of this year we will have a cohort of teachers from all our schools in the district.

Interim Superintendent Thomas mentioned we must do much better. Interim Superintendent Thomas has visited every school in the system and noted that teachers are working hard considering the past six years budgets and the fact that many teachers have had to move to different grades and schools, which has sent our district in a disarray along with our budget. We need to do better for our children focusing on where we need to in the areas of teaching and learning, attendance, advance level classes in more schools.

## **FY20 Budget Update**

Interim Superintendent Thomas reported there is no FY20 budget update at this time, the Senate voted on the Governor's bill, Student Opportunity Act and will go to the House next. He thanked our local legislators, Representative Claire Cronin, Gerard Cassidy, Michelle DuBois and Senator Michael Brady for their hard work and dedication. He also reported that Tripp Jones and the city law office have written the lawsuit and are waiting to see what funding we receive from the House. If proper funding is not received the lawsuit will be filed.

# <u>Ratification of Memorandum of Agreement – Independent Brockton Administrative</u> Assistants and -Technical Employees Association (IBAA-TEA)

Mr. Sullivan, Chair of the committee gave an update on the IBAA-TEA Ratification. Many meetings were held and he believes both sides came to a respectful and reasonable agreement.

Mr. Bath moved to ratify the Memorandum of Agreement between the Brockton School Committee and the Independent Brockton Administrative Assistants and - Technical Employees Association (IBAA-TEA), effective for a three-year period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2022. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gormley.

Voted: to approve the motion, unanimous.

## Ratification of Memorandum of Agreement – Monitor Teacher Assistants (MTA)

Mr. Sullivan, Chair of the committee gave an update on the MTA Ratification. Many meeting were held and he believes both sides came to a respectful and reasonable agreement.

Mr. Bath moved to ratify the Memorandum of Agreement between the Brockton School Committee and the Monitor Teacher Assistants (MTA), effective for a three-year period from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2022. The motion was seconded by Mr. D'Agostino.
