*-Offers programs that can help with housing and other essential needs. In order to address housing issues, grant funds and other forms of financial assistance can only be used to support clients that qualify as at-risk of homelessness or people who are currently homeless. Assistance may include: Help paying for overdue or ongoing monthly rent, security deposits, and even expenses such as service animal deposits. Any type of utility bill assistance provided is limited to natural gas, electricity, sewer, water, utility deposits, and garbage expenses. The other resource can help with paying for essential needs. This is fairly broad ranging, and essential needs includes items like assistance with obtaining cleaning supplies (dish soap and laundry), personal health and hygiene items (toilet paper, toothpaste, shampoo), & transportation such as bus passes.*
