# Stewardship Renewal

## Parish Operating Fund



### 2019-20 Parish Operating Budget

Fiscal year 2018-19 (July-June) ended with a deficit in the Sacred Heart parish operating fund (expenses exceeded revenues) for the first time in four years. Over the last four years, total **income has decreased about 2%**, while operating **expenses have increased about 2%**, a 4% swing.

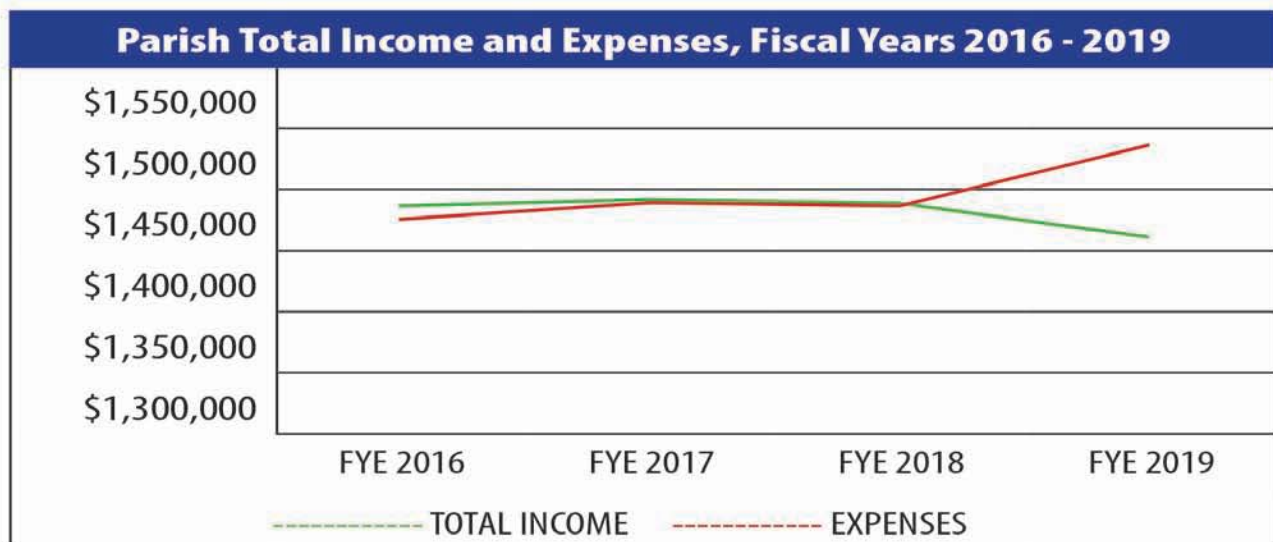
For three of the four years, expenses were able to be managed so that the parish had a small surplus at the end of the year. The reasons for the shortfall in 2018-19 included several significant one-time special expenses (such as the 4 in 1 Capital Campaign) and several substantial cost of living increases in regular expenses (such as property and liability insurance premiums from the Archdiocese of Seattle).

As expenses increase, revenue must increase as well if we are to maintain the fiscally responsible operation of Sacred Heart Parish and still be able to offer the programs and services of a viable faith community which parishioners have come to expect.

Ramifications for the future include:

- To balance the 2019-20 operating budget, the Pastoral Assistant for Youth Ministry position on the parish staff was eliminated. Some duties of this position are being carried out by other members of the parish staff.
- Our property and liability insurance premiums from the Archdiocese of Seattle have increased 46% over the last two years.
- With more parishioners using online giving to make their church contributions—a good thing—our bank fees have gone up 41% over the last two years.
- Our employee medical insurance premiums have increased 13% over the last two years.
- With the \$500K overage in the 4 in 1 Church Project construction budget, the parish may have a debt service expense in the operating budget for the first time in a long time.

## Notes to Financial Statement:

[1] Every year, the parish and school operating funds budget and transfer an amount to the parish and school capital funds. This recognizes the necessity to put aside substantial money for major maintenance and repair needs as good stewards of our facility-related resources.

[2] The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) rebate is an important funding source for the parish capital fund. From the 2018 ACA effort, we received a rebate of \$33,510. Making and fulfilling your ACA pledge made this possible.

[3] The interest from our parish general savings account with the archdiocese is an important funding source for the parish capital fund and is included here. Also included are direct donations to the capital fund made through our offering envelope and online giving systems.

[4] The 4 in 1 Capital Campaign kicked into high gear during October 2018 and so far has received payments of over \$1 million on pledges of over \$2 million. Expenditures for the church project will occur during the spring, summer and fall of 2019 and will be reported in the 2019-20 fiscal year.

[5] At the 2019 School Auction in February, \$129,886 was raised through Fund-A-Need to update the Primary School restrooms. Expenditures for that project will occur during the summer of 2019 and will be reported in the 2019-20 fiscal year.

[6] During the summer of 2018, monies were spent to update and renovate the Middle School public student restrooms which also included creating two private teacher restrooms.

[7] During the summer of 2018, the school purchased some new classroom furniture and the church sacristy floor/carpet was replaced. The latter project involved removing the old asbestos-containing flooring which always adds greatly to the cost.



## Dear Sacred Heart Community,

For the past year-and-a-half, we have been working on writing a self-study of our school in preparation for our accreditation visit and review by the Western Catholic Educational Association in February of 2020. Every six years, we go through this formal process of writing a self-study and having a visiting team of teachers and administrators from other Catholic schools visit our school and write a report about what they read, saw, and heard.

The most important part of this process, though, is that it is intended to support an ongoing focus on self-review and improvement, not just every six years, but each year. At Sacred Heart School, we have embraced this growth mindset.

There are important traditions at our school that have been around as long as anyone here can remember, like the 8th grade "Clap Out" at the end of their last day of school before graduation, the Shoe Liturgy in support of Treehouse, and Field Day in May. These events, and others, are an important part of the fabric of who we are as a community. Of course, the tradition at the heart of our school is our Catholic Faith.

But we are a community rooted in tradition, not one that is tied down by it. Our teachers, staff, and administrators are continually looking for ways to improve the education, moral guidance, and spiritual formation we provide to our students and to improve the operations of our school in ways that enhance learning and make the lives of our community members better. Among many other improvements, in the six years since our last accreditation we have added a school counselor to our staff, adopted new reading, writing, and math programs, added the Accelerated Reader program to our curriculum, begun offering NET Ministries retreats to our middle school students, and added coding, robotics, and other technology programs.

Of course, the innovation and growth that has taken place at our school over the last six years, as well as the sixty years before that, is due in no small part to the support of our community. The financial donations, volunteer service, and prayers that we have received over that time make it possible for our school community to continually strive for excellence.

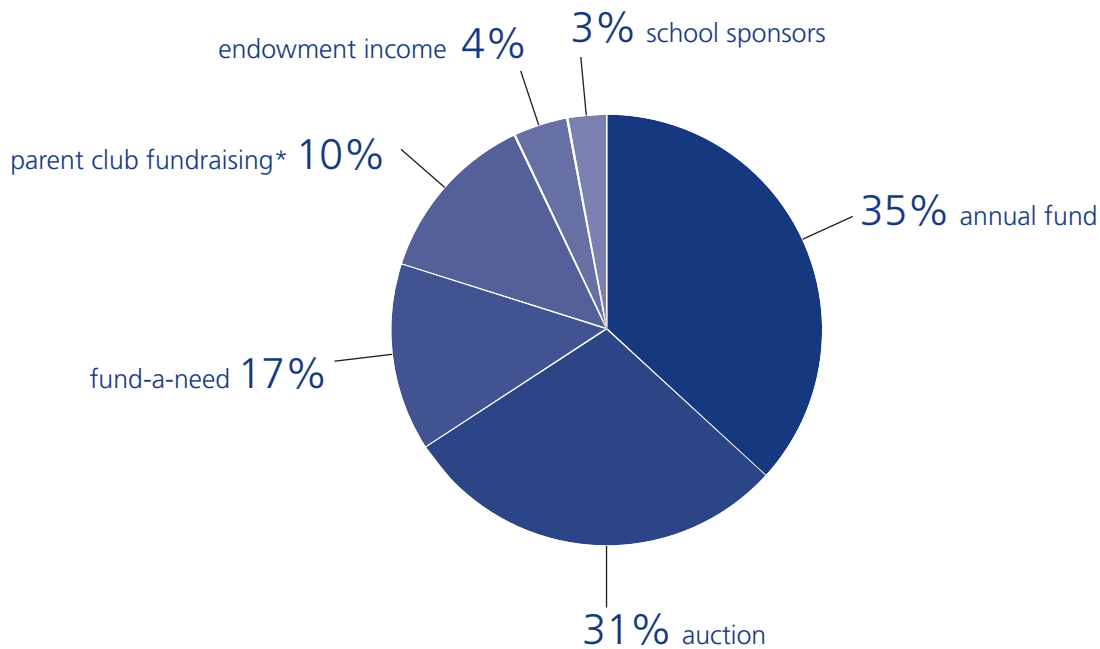
