With the rapidly changing global economy, students will need to think outside the box and then communicate their thinking in an effective manner.

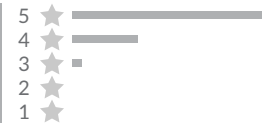

Students should graduate with an understanding that our community and our world include a diverse population and all are valuable to each other.

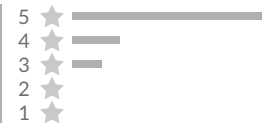

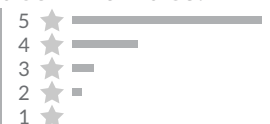

Students will need to see another's point of view in a respectful manner even if there is disagreement. A respectful exchange of ideas is encouraged.

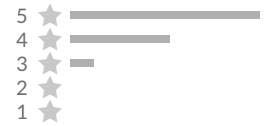
