Overview

St. Francis Xavier Catholic High School is a co-educational, fully accredited (AdvancED and NCEA) Catholic school community. With state-of-the-art facilities, small class sizes and a curriculum consistent with current trends, we offer the highest quality faith-based education while stressing the importance of engaged leadership with moral and social responsibility.

Mission Statement

Block Schedule

Xavier runs on a block schedule (four 90 minute classes each day) with students taking 8 credits a year in grades 9-11. Seniors may take a minimum of 6 credits.

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to earn a minimum of 29 credits to graduate. All students must also complete a minimum of 80 hours community service.

Credits: Theology(4 credits), English (4), Mathematics (3), Science (3), Social Studies (3), Physical Education (1.5), Fine Arts (1), Business & Technology (1), Health (0.5), Electives (8)

Policy for Retaking a Class

A student may retake a class at Xavier High School if the student earns less than a C in the class. The transcript will reflect that the class was retaken by substituting an R for the original grade. The GPA will be recalculated with the replacement grade. The grades of a retaken class may not be used to determine a valedictorian or salutatorian.

Policy for Courses Not Offered at Xavier

Xavier students must receive prior administrative approval in order to take a high school course or college credit course that will appear on the Xavier transcript. Approved high school and college courses will be noted on the transcript. Credit may be awarded by Xavier, but the grade will not be calculated in the Xavier GPA.

Faculty

The teaching faculty consists of 31 full-time, and 16 part-time teachers. All hold bachelor's degrees, 24 hold master's degrees, and three have earned a doctorate.
