Be fully present

Speak from the “I” perspective

Be self-responsible and self-challenging

Listen to understand, not to respond

Lean into discomfort

Take risks, be raggedy, make some mistakes, then let go

Accept conflict and its resolution as a necessary catalyst for learning

Be comfortable with silence

Allow space for everyone to share before you speak again

Be crisp; say what’s core

Assume positive intent

Treat the candidness of others as a gift; honor confidentiality

Suspend judgment of yourself and of others

Stay on topic

Respect
