Whenever an adult reads to a child, 3 things happen:

- A pleasure connection is made between the child and the book.
- Both adult and child are learning and invested in the book.
- The adult is pouring sounds and words into the child's ears.

The sounds collect into a reservoir called listening vocabulary.

The more this occurs, the larger the reservoir gets until it spills out into speaking, reading, and writing vocabulary.
