Dear Parent,

With the older classes, we explored how naming our emotion 2-3 times creates **space** for mindfulness

before reacting to the emotion, for example saying "frustrated frustrated" or "angry angry," etc. With younger grades, we practiced noticing emotions and where students feel emotions in the body. Invite your child to teach you about the lesson they learned today about **Emotions.** Model naming your own **emotions** out loud and encourage your child to do the same.

Mindfulness of Emotions is a powerful application of mindfulness. We explored emotions today by naming emotions (happy, mad, sad, scared, etc.) and noticing how emotions affect body sensations.




