Ongoing Volunteer Opportunities

Senior Year Internships (September – May)

Delta High School seeks business partners to provide students real-world job experience during their senior year! Delta's Work-Based Learning Coordinator will work with you and your company to structure the internship to benefit both the student and your business. Placements begin in September, December, and March, and last from 12 - 36 weeks. Students work an average of 10 - 15 hours per week, and earn high school credit. Internships may be paid or unpaid.

Career Guest Speakers (October – May)

STEM professionals share their professional and higher education experiences with 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students, as students investigate potential career interests.

Senior Culminating Project Mentor & Judges (November / March / June)

Volunteers mentor our seniors as they research / create a project of their choosing. Community guests assess student presentations on senior culminating projects, which are presented at the end of each trimester. Topics will vary widely, but may include internships, academic competition project work, or connections to future careers. Time commitment can range from one 1/2-day session to multiple days throughout the year.

Annual Events

Nuke Tech Day (October)

Workshops focus on aspects of nuclear technology, including experiments, program tours, and business tours. Approximately 110 students participate.

Health Science Day – Workshop Facilitators (October)

Workshops focus on expanding knowledge and interest in medical careers and support school-based health curriculum. Approximately 115 students participate.

Resume Review Volunteers (November – December)

As students prepare for the workplace, including senior year internships, building an attractive resume provides practice in real life skills. Human Resource professionals are needed to provide advice on revising resumes for maximum impact. This event lasts approximately two hours and is typically held in November/December.

Mock Interviews Volunteers (January)

Mock interviews provide practice in real life skills and help students prepare to apply for senior year internships as well as college entrance. This event lasts approximately 2 hours. Sample questions and scoring rubrics are provided. Approximately 55 volunteers are needed. Each student has the opportunity to be interviewed by at least 2 business professionals. Approximately 100 students participate.

National History Day Fair Judges (February)

National History Day Fair provides students an opportunity to share their independent historical research projects, including websites, documentaries, exhibits, performances, and research papers. The project is embedded in both the freshmen and sophomore social studies courses. Delta's fair provides students valuable feedback before moving on to the National History Day Regional Competition. Approximately 225 students participate.

STEM-Con Workshop Facilitators (March)

At STEM-Con, students from across the Mid-Columbia spend time with local STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) professionals, participating in hands-on, engaging activities designed to give students a glimpse into real-world STEM careers in action. Sessions can run ½ day (two hours) or full day (four hours, with a break for lunch). Support is provided to prepare your session and make your expertise kid-friendly. Approximately 350 students participate.

Job Shadow Day – Business Partners (April)

Students participate in two half-day job shadow experiences during their junior year. Each placement is approximately two hours, and transportation is provided by the school. Students may be placed individually, or in small groups. Approximately 100 students participate.

Intern Fair (May)

Businesses interested in hosting a senior intern at the beginning of the next school year have an opportunity to meet multiple, qualified Delta students for on-site interviews. Follow-up interviews can be scheduled before the end of the year, to make placements and paperwork easy! Delta's work based learning coordinator will support you in preparing for this event.
