President's Comments

Mrs. Grimm welcomed all to the meeting and a special welcome to students in attendance.

Superintendent's Report

Lunch with Administrators

Superintendent Erdle told the Board that Monday, September 25 was her first Lunch with the Administrators with 15 second graders in attendance. The lunch was exciting for the students and Administrators. Two thank you notes were passed around to the Board from two of the students. Monday, October 7 thirteen first graders have been invited to have lunch with the Superintendent and Administrators.

<u>Transportation Recognition</u>

Mr. Scott Goble, Director of Transportation, introduced Ms. Debbie Bowen, Head Bus Driver and Trainer, to the Board. Ms. Bowen has been a bus driver for 25 years and a trainer for 10. She is respected both locally and across the state. At the New York State Association for Pupil Transportation, Ms. Bowen was awarded the New York State Bus School Bus Driver Instructor of the Year. Ms. Bowen commented on how much she loves her job. She cares about all the students and their safety on the school bus.

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Mr. Goble then introduced Mr. Brian Lyons, Bus Driver, who at the same conference won for the third straight year the New York State Bus Safety Road-eo. Mr. Lyons will travel to Charleston, South Carolina in July of 2014 to compete in the international event. Mr. Lyons also expressed his joy for his job and his top priority of bus safety for students.

'Brag About'

Mr. Jim Simmons, Athletic Director, introduced eight grade student, Riley Poisson, who recently ran in a cross country race. He read the following statement:

On Tuesday September 24, Canandaigua Cross Country teams were racing against Greece Athena, Brighton and Hilton schools at Mendon Ponds Park. In the modified division race, Canandaigua 8th grader Riley Poisson jumped out to a significant early lead. Several minutes into the race it became clear to Riley that one her teammates running close by was struggling with her breathing. At this point Riley had to make a decision to continue running (and likely win the race by a significant margin) or offer help to a teammate in need. Riley made the decision to stop, offer assistance, and then run back up the hill to get help for her teammate from an adult near the start of the course. She quickly got help and then ran back and finished the race, still coming in ahead of some competitors. This decision by Riley demonstrated tremendous character and showed her desire to put the welfare of another ahead of her winning the race. We are all very proud of Riley and the way she conducted herself in this situation!

Ms. Poisson was applauded and thanked by the Board.

The Committee reviewed the year over year variances, budget, reserve funds, fund balances, checks and balances internal controls. He stated New York State schools continue to face many challenges in pension, state aid and the affordable health care act. Canandaigua has done a good job in reacting to these challenges. The Board thanked Mrs. Pierce and her team for their excellent work.

Board Committee Reports

Board of Regents

Mr. Bill Patrowicz reported the Regents met on September 16 and 17 with their next meeting scheduled for October 21 and 22. These meetings are available via webcast. Mr. Mike Ford, Local School Superintendent, represented our area in a recent roundtable regarding the Common Core.

Strategic Planning Committee

Mrs. Pedzich reported on the September 30 Strategic Planning Council meeting. The Committee was provided an overview of the process with the below:

- Vision Summit will be conducted this Saturday, October 5th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. It is an open meeting that will help frame the vision. All Board members are expected to attend this meeting. Dr. Julie Winston will take the information from this session and will work with the writing team on October 9th to develop a framework for the district vision statement.
- Focus groups/interviews will be held on October 24th and 25th and will involve 200-400 stakeholders. A report will be issued in mid-November. A public survey will be conducted and completed by January 1st.

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- Surveys and research will be reviewed and summarized by the Warner Team. They will review the program, staff, and facilities reports plus other data such as audits and budgets. This research report will be presented at our October 15th full day District Planning Team meeting.
- The District Planning Team will break up and in some cases lead small study groups from January 13th through March 1st to work on analyzing all of the data, identifying strategic issues, and conducting SWOT analysis, and identifying specific initiatives for these issues. The goal is to not have any one principal working on more than four initiatives at any one time.
- Strategic Planning reports will be provided at BOE meetings on January 9th, April 24th, and possibly May 22nd (if necessary).
