

CHARTIERS VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT'S MUSIC EDUCATION PROGRAM RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Chartiers Valley School District was tomored with the Best Communities for Moste Education designation from the NAMM Foundation for its outstanding commitment to music education.

Now in its 20th, year, the Best Communities for Music Education disagnation is avariated to district that demonstrate outstanding schievement in efforts to provide music access and education to all anaders. To quality, Chartiers Valley unswered destailed questime about funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instruction time, facilities, and support for the music programs. Responses were verified with school officials and reviewed by the Music Research Institute at the University of Karnasa.

FREE PRODUCE THROUGH THE FARMERS MARKET PROGRAM FOR ELIGIBLE SENIORS
