ABOUT STONYHURST

Stonyhurst College is the UK's leading Catholic co-educational boarding and day school for pupils aged 3-18. Boarding is from the age of 7.

At the College, there are approximately 500 pupils aged 13-18, two thirds of whom are boarders. At Stonyhurst St Mary's Hall, the adjacent dedicated preparatory school, there are around 300 pupils aged 3-13. Stonyhurst is set in stunning countryside, near the Ribble and Hodder rivers and the beautiful Trough of Bowland. Manchester is only about an hour away by road or rail. The market town of Clitheroe is four miles away, and we are 12 miles from the city of Preston. The Lake District can be reached in about an hour, and the Yorkshire Dales are even closer.

Stonyhurst has a fascinating heritage, being the oldest continuously active Jesuit school in the world. It was founded in St Omer, Northern France (then the Spanish Netherlands), in 1593, and moved to its present site in Lancashire's beautiful Ribble Valley in 1794. Throughout the years of religious persecution in England, Stonyhurst educated the boys of the English Catholic aristocracy and gentry.

This year Stonyhurst celebrates 20 years of full co-education. Our roll is 50/50 boys and girls.

The College's Jesuit mission and identity, and its sense of family, set Stonyhurst apart from other schools. Pupils are urged to do as much as they can (*Quant Je Puis*) for other people following the example of Jesus Christ and following in the spirit and charism of the Jesuits. The College prepares young people to change the world for others.

Stonyhurst is a family where heritage and innovation are fused to inspire young people to be agents of change in the world.



CONTEXT

We are looking for a Physics Teacher to join an enthusiastic and successful department and teach Physics to pupils aged 11 to 18, up to and including A Level or IB Physics.

An ability to offer a physics based extra-curricular activity such as Robotics or Astronomy (Stonyhurst has its own Observatory) would be welcome and the ability to teach some KS3 Maths is desirable.

PHYSICS AT STONYHURST

At Stonyhurst you will teach pupils about the universe and the amazing range of different ways that nature's building blocks can be put together and interact with each other.

You will encourage pupils to look critically at the world and how our ideas about it have developed through the ages.

We aim to help students develop skills and capabilities that will help them in their adult and working lives. Many of our students go on to study science based courses at university.

The Physics Department currently offers the following examination courses: GCSE Physics: AQA Specification 8463.


A-Level Physics: OCR Physics B (Advancing Physics), Specification H557.

IB Physics.

The department is well resourced with a full time Physics Technician, a prep room, a small workshop, a dark room, three well equipped teaching laboratories fitted with interactive whiteboards, a large project laboratory and a shared ICT suite with 24 computers. In addition there is a department office/teacher resource area and a HOD's office.

Every pupil at GCSE and Higher Line has their own textbooks and exam revision books. All the GCSE sciences are taught as separate subjects, and despite being an optional subject, the uptake for physics is very high.

At A-Level, there are 2 sets in each year group. IB Physics is taught at both Standard and Higher Level. Exam results are consistently strong at all levels and our pupils regularly win medals, including gold, in the GCSE and A-Level British Physics Olympiad competitions.





KEY TEACHING RESPONSIBILITIES

Range of responsibilities usually undertaken by a teacher:

- Actively promote the Stonyhurst ethos as set out in our Mission Statement.
- A full teaching load.
- Such contribution to the smooth-running of their academic department as is required by the Head of Department.
- A contribution to games and/or extra-curricular activities.
- An involvement in boarding pastoral care, usually as a member of a playroom or house team.
- Provide tutorial support as tutor to a group of pupils.
- Cover for absent staff as required.
- Attend whole school events such as assemblies, school masses, etc.
- Attend events such as parents' weekends, Great Academies, etc., as required from time to time.
- One or more weekly studies supervision duties.
- One or more other weekly staff duties.
