Background

Interest-based bargaining is a negotiation style in which parties collaborate to find mutually beneficial solutions to problems. This strategy focuses on developing mutually beneficial agreements based on the interests of the parties. Interests include the needs, desires, concerns, and fears important to each side. IBB gives each party a better opportunity to solve complicated problems and build ongoing relationships that allow both sides to maximize interests. The District has utilized facilitation services from this consultant since 2017.

Budget Impact

This General Fund expenditure is budgeted not-to-exceed \$40,000.

Recommended Action

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve an agreement with Barber and Gonzales Consulting Group to provide Interest-Based Bargaining (IBB) facilitation for District, CSEA, and LaBUFA negotiations teams in a not-to-exceed amount of \$40,000.

CONSULTING AGREEMENT: Personal Services

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 17th day of September, 2019 by and between Barber & Gonzales Consulting, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant" and the Laguna Beach Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "District".

WHEREAS, the District is in need of special services and advice in administrative matters;

and

WHEREAS, such services and advice are not available at no cost from public agencies;

and

WHEREAS, Consultant is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide the special services and advice required; and

WHEREAS, such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. SERVICES to be provided by Consultant:

Preparation for and facilitation of the Interest Based Approach to collective bargaining / negotiations, as scheduled by the Superintendent or designated manager.

2. The Consultant will commence providing services under this AGREEMENT from October 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. The Consultant will perform said services as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the District. Consultant shall be under the direction of the District as to the result to be accomplished and not as to the means or manner by which such result is to be accomplished.

3. The District will prepare and furnish to the Consultant upon request such information, facilities, and materials as are reasonably necessary to the performance of the Consultant to this AGREEMENT.

4. The District shall pay the Consultant a total amount not to exceed \$40,000 (forty thousand dollars) for services and expenses rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Consultant shall submit periodic invoices to the District reflecting such services and expenses. Invoices shall be submitted to the District 30 days in advance of each payment due date.

a. In particular to this AGREEMENT the parties are agreed to engage in a minimum of 1 days of preparation for negotiation with one bargaining unit and 9 days of actual, facilitated negotiations between both bargaining units. The parties are also agreed that with regard to the preparation stage of the negotiations, per mutual design between the consultant and the District, the bargaining units may be mutually engaged/involved.

b. The parties are agreed that the Consultant may, at the discretion of the Consultant, sub-contract with other professional colleagues in order to provide supportive facilitative or consulting services in pursuit of the specific needs of the District in pursuit of the purposes of this AGREEMENT.

c. Rate structure: Lead Consultant/facilitator: \$2600 p/day; Support/Co Facilitator: \$1800.00 p/day; travel and associated expenses billed to District as incurred with receipts provided.

5. The District may at any time for any reason terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate the Consultant only for services rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by the Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources of the District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Consultant. The notice shall be deemed given when received or no later than three days after the day of mailing whichever is sooner.

6. There may occur rare occasions when the District should find it necessary to cancel an agreed to date(s) for services to be rendered by the Consultant. Should such cancellation occur within two weeks of the scheduled date(s) Consultant will be compensated for the cancelled dates at a rate of 50% of the ordinary daily rate of the Consultant. Should such cancellation occur within 7 days of the scheduled date(s) Consultant will be compensated in full for the cancelled date(s).

7. Consultant agrees to and shall hold harmless and indemnify the District, its officers, agents, and employees from every claim or demand and every liability or loss, damage, or expense which may be incurred by reason of the following:

a. Liability for damages for death or bodily injury to person, injury to property, or any other loss, damage, or expense sustained by the Consultant or any person, firm, or corporation employed by the Consultant upon or in connection with the negligent performance of services by the Consultant called for in this AGREEMENT, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of the District, its officers, employees, or agents.

b. Liability for any injury to or death of persons or damage to property, sustained by any persons, firm, or corporation, including the District, arising out of, or in any way connected with the negligent performance of services by the Consultant called for in this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District, its officers, employees, or agents.

In the event of the negligent performance of the services to be rendered by the Consultant per this AGREEMENT at Consultant's expense, cost, and risk the Consultant shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceeding that may be brought or instituted against the District, it officers, agents, or employees

8. This AGREEMENT is not assignable without the written consent of the parties hereto.

9. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances including worker's compensation.

10. Consultant, if an employee of another public agency, certifies that Consultant will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

Background

Dennis Parker brings a broad range of field experiences as a high school and college teacher, elementary resource teacher, district bilingual program director, and pre-school principal. He has consulted for schools and districts all over the US. In addition, he holds credentials for teaching, administration, and bilingual-crosscultural education as well as a Master's degree in Applied Linguistics and graduate work in Multicultural Education. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Agreement is hereby entered into between the Laguna Beach Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and <u>Dennis R. Parker, Education Consultant</u>, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor."

WHEREAS, District is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, District is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by Contractor</u>. Contractor shall provide to District the following services: <u>One day professional development on best classroom practices related to increasing student engagement at Thurston Middle School on October 16, 2019.</u>

Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement upon and will diligently perform as required and complete

performance by October 16, 2019.

 <u>Compensation</u>. District agrees to pay the Contractor for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement <u>a total fee not to exceed \$2,500.00</u>. District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions: <u>Upon completion of services and</u> receipt of invoice.

4. <u>Expenses</u>. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing Services for District.

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor, in the performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of its employees or agents as they relate to the Services to be provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows: N/A

Contractor's Services will be performed in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

Originality of Services/Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees that all ideas, 7. technologies, formulae, procedures, processes and methods prepared for and submitted by Contractor to the District in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Contractor and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Contractor by District as a basis for such Services. Contractor further agrees that all writings, materials, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, or otherwise (hereinafter referred to as "Content") submitted by Contractor to the District and/or used in connection with the Services set forth in this Agreement, reflect the intellectual property of, and copyright interests held by District and shall not be copied or used in whole or in part by Contractor without District's express written permission. Contractor understands and agrees that all Content produced under this Agreement is the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that District shall have all right, title and interest in said Content, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said Content in the name of the District.

8. <u>Termination</u>. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or (b) any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within five (5) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the five (5) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required Services from another contractor. If the cost to the District to secure the required Services from another contractor exceeds the cost of providing the Services pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the Contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District. Written notice by District shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor, or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

9. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the District and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the Contractor or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the Services called for in this Agreement, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the District's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the Contractor, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the Contractor, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the Services covered by this Agreement, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off District's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this Agreement.

10. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall insure Contractor's activities in connection with the Services under this Agreement and agrees to carry insurance to ensure Contractor's ability to adhere to the indemnification requirements under this Agreement.

c. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, if applicable; \$2,000,000 aggregate.

d. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Insurance in a form and amount covering Contractor's full liability under the California Workers' Compensation Insurance and Safety Act and in accordance with applicable state and federal laws. Contractor and/or Contractor's current and subsequent employees shall check in with the District or school site office each day immediately upon arriving at the District or school site; employees shall inform District or school site office staff of their proposed activities and location at the District or school site; once at the District or school site, Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall not change locations without contacting the District or school site office; Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall not use student restroom facilities; and, if Contractor and/or Contractor's employees encounter any students, Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall immediately leave the area and contact the District or school site office and receive further direction from District or school site office staff.

12.2. <u>Tuberculosis Testing</u>. Contractor and/or Contractor's current and subsequent employees providing Services to the District agree to undergo tuberculosis screening and to submit written verification of negative results for tuberculosis, if required by the District, prior to commencing Services pursuant to this Agreement.

 <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

14. <u>Employment with Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

15. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third

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day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. Staff propose that Dr. Herman present to Thurston social studies staff on geography and geographic thinking in the History-Social Science Framework. The presentation will focus on disciplinary perspectives and content knowledge, and provide connection to a variety of resources for inquiry-based instruction.

The budget impact is not-to-exceed \$500 to be paid through site funds.

Contractor and/or Contractor's current and subsequent employees shall not come in contact with students until the Department of Justice has ascertained that the Contractor and/or Contractor's employees have not been convicted of a serious or violent felony. Contractor shall certify in writing to the Governing Board of the District that none of its employees who may come in contact with students have been convicted of a serious or violent felony; and shall provide to the Governing Board of the District a list of names of its employees who may come in contact with students. Contractor shall fulfill these requirements at its own expense. The District may require the Contractor and its current and subsequent employees to submit to additional criminal records checks at the District's sole and absolute discretion.

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If the District has determined that fingerprinting is not required, the

Contractor and/or Contractor's current and subsequent employees shall check in with the District or school site office each day immediately upon arriving at the District or school site; employees shall inform District or school site office staff of their proposed activities and location at the District or school site; once at the District or school site, Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall not change locations without contacting the District or school site office; Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall not use student restroom facilities; and, if Contractor and/or Contractor's employees encounter any students, Contractor and/or Contractor's employees shall immediately leave the area and contact the District or school site office and receive further direction from District or school site office staff.

12.2. <u>Tuberculosis Testing</u>. Contractor and/or Contractor's current and subsequent employees providing Services to the District agree to undergo tuberculosis screening and to submit written verification of negative results for tuberculosis, if required by the District, prior to commencing Services pursuant to this Agreement.

13. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

14. <u>Employment with Public Agency</u>. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

15. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire Agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or Agreement with respect to the Services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the Agreement. This Agreement incorporates by this reference, any exhibits, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

16. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. Contractor agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, ethnicity, religion, nationality, disability, gender, sex, marital status, age, or other characteristics protected by federal or state laws of such persons.

17. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of District or Contractor to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this Agreement, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

18. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this Agreement by either party to the other shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third

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day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. At the date of this Agreement, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

23. <u>Authorized Signatures</u>. The individual signing this Agreement warrants that he/she is authorized to do so. The Parties understand and agree that a breach of this warranty shall constitute a breach of the Agreement and shall entitle the non-breaching party to all appropriate legal and equitable remedies against the breaching party.

24. <u>Governing Law</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. Goal 1 - Increase student academic achievement and social/emotional strength through collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, and communication.

Proposal

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between WestEd and Laguna Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) for the administration of the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) for students in grades 7, 9, and 11. This survey is part of the comprehensive Cal-SCHLS data system, developed by WestEd under contract with the California Department of Education.

Background

The California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) is administered as part of the requirements for the Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) grant every two years. The data received from the anonymous student survey given to 7th, 9th, and 11th graders helps staff to identify an array of critical school climate indicators, including perceptions of safety, connections with staff, motivation toward school, health, and alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use and perceptions. The data provides reliable and valid periodic measurement of school climate strengths and areas of need to better serve and support students' social-emotional development, health, and physical development. Additionally, the data assists staff in understanding student attitudes and perceptions regarding school and community issues. The data will also be used to help meet the Local Control Accountability Plan requirements and provide additional insights to drive goal development.

Budget Impact

There will be no budget impact to LBUSD. The cost of this MOU will be covered by the Orange County County Department of Education as a member district participating in the TUPE Grant consortium within Orange County.

Recommended Action

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the MOU between WestEd and Laguna Beach Unified School District for the administration of the California Healthy Kids Survey for students in grades 7, 9, and 11 during the 2019-2020 school year.

I. DISTRICT AGREES TO:

- Coordination. Provide one district-level contact person for each participating district.
- Surveys. Administer each CalSCHLS survey selected by District (CHKS, CSSS, and/or CSPS) according to the procedures in the CalSCHLS Administration Instructions. Ensure that each survey administered is the most recent version.
- Data Submission and Report Preparation. Notify CalSCHLS Regional Center staff upon completion of each survey administration per the guidelines provided at registration.

CALIFORNIA HEALTHY KIDS SURVEY (CHKS) ADMINISTRATION

- Grades and Schools. Survey Grades 3 through 12 as appropriate within the District. Provide current student enrollment figures for all schools by grade level.
- Parent Consent. Follow the active parental consent process with grades below seven, and passive parental consent with Grade 7 and above.
 - Follow written school board policy for active and/or passive consent and provide notification to parents of the approximate date(s) of survey administration and the availability of survey instruments for review at school and/or district offices. This is required regardless of consent type.
- Privacy of Students. Preserve respondent privacy and the confidentiality of the responses by ensuring that
 the room set-up prevents anyone from observing how the respondent is answering the survey questions and
 ensure that reasonable measures are taken to protect the responses after they are collected.
- Assurance of Confidentiality Agreement, Ensure that all teachers/proctors assigned to administer the survey sign the Assurance of Confidentiality Agreement and read the Introductory Script to students.
- Response Rates. Make best efforts to obtain a response rate of at least 70% of students in surveyed grades.

CALIFORNIA SCHOOL STAFF SURVEY (CSSS) ADMINISTRATION

 Ensure that all staff at participating schools have the opportunity to complete the online survey (CSSS) at each school and for each grade level.

CALIFORNIA SCHOOL PARENT SURVEY (CSPS) ADMINISTRATION

- Coordinate with CalSCHLS staff regarding the administration of online and paper parent survey materials.
 - 1 CAL-SCHLS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- Administer the CSPS to all parents, guardians, or other caregivers of students in all grades and schools in the district.
- Each family (parent/guardian/caregiver) should complete only one survey per school regardless of number of children enrolled in that school.

PAYMENT

Make payment of all CalSCHLS fees, at the current rates for the applicable school year within thirty (30) days of completion of services and receipt of deliverables. See attached fee schedule for the 2019-2020 school year.

II. WESTED AGREES TO PROVIDE:

- Comprehensive technical assistance via email and phone.
- Access to the CHKS online system or master copies of the survey instrument with scantrons and materials.
- Access to the CSSS online system.
- Access to the CSPS online system and master copy of the survey instrument for paper administration.
- Access to the CalSCHLS System website (calschls.org).
- Access to the integrated CalSCHLS Administration Instructions on each of the survey websites, which shall
 cover the tasks that need to be performed in conducting the surveys, and provide step-by-step instructions to
 District staff with responsibility for coordinating the survey.
- Access to the CalSCHLS Administration PowerPoint presentation, which shall be posted on the CalSCHLS website.
- Monthly editions of the School Climate Connection Newsletter during the school year.
- Scanning and online services.
- District-level reports within six to ten weeks after receipt of accurate and complete survey information and materials.

III. ACCESS

Under the Public Records Act, any third-party (for example, the media) can request existing district reports from CDE. Raw data may be provided to public agencies and research agencies by request for analyses only after the requesting agency has executed an agreement with WestEd and/or CDE and has agreed to conditions of strict confidentiality in compliance with state and federal regulations including, but not limited to, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR part 99), the California Information Practices Act (California Civil Code § 1798 et seq.), and the Privacy Act of 1974, as amended (5 U.S.C. § 552).

CalSCHLS Regional Center staff post CalSCHLS reports (CHKS and CSSS) to the CalSCHLS System websites in November of the year following survey administration.

IV. CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT

Districts agreeing to administer any of the CalSCHLS surveys (CHKS, CSSS, and CSPS), understand that data will be subject to the conditions stated above. Once produced, district-level reports will be available to outside agencies via the website or upon request, and raw data may be provided to public and research agencies for analysis under strict conditions of confidentiality. District further agrees to use the CalSCHLS surveys only for use in its own district, and only for so long as this MOU is in effect. Upon expiration or termination of this MOU, District agrees to return all CalSCHLS materials to WestEd or CDE.

V. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a. Terms. This MOU is effective on September 1, 2019 and expires on August 31, 2020.
- b. <u>Amendments</u>. This MOU may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties without additional consideration, provided that before any amendment shall take effect, it shall be in writing and signed by both parties.
- c. <u>Severability</u>. The provision of this MOU are severable and the unenforceability of any provision of this MOU shall not affect the enforceability of any other provision hereof.
- d. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. Each party shall bear all costs, risk, and liabilities incurred by it arising out if its obligations and efforts under this MOU. Neither party shall have any right to reimbursement, payment or compensation of any kind from the other party, unless expressly agreed to in writing.
- e. Indemnification. District shall defend, indemnify, and hold WestEd, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this MOU but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or resulting from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of District, its officers, agents, or employees.

WestEd shall defend, indemnify, and hold District, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this MOU but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or resulting from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of WestEd, its officers, agents, or employees.

- f. <u>Dispute resolution</u>. District and WestEd shall exercise commercially reasonable efforts to settle any claim, controversy, or dispute (collectively, "Dispute") arising out of or relating to this MOU. The parties shall discuss any Dispute no later than thirty (30) days after either party gives written notice to the other party of a Dispute, including the legal and factual basis for such Dispute. No arbitration or other proceeding may be commenced before the parties have met pursuant to this provision. In the event that a Dispute cannot be resolved through good faith negotiations, the parties agree that such Dispute shall be finally settled through binding arbitration. The arbitration shall be administered by JAMS, in San Francisco, California, pursuant to its Comprehensive Arbitration Rules and Procedures. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and conclusive upon the parties. Judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may seek injunctive or provisional relief to protect confidential information at any time.
- g. <u>Assignment</u>. District shall not voluntarily or by operation of law, assign or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under this MOU without prior written consent from WestEd. Any purported assignment in violation of this paragraph shall be void.
- h. <u>Execution</u>. This MOU has been negotiated by all parties and shall not be strictly construed against the parties. This MOU may be executed in one or more original, electronic, or faxed counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Each of the persons signing this MOU represents that he or she has the authority to sign on behalf of and bind their respective party.

The First Quarter Report recaps the number of Uniform Complaints received by the District in the three areas governed by the Williams Case Settlement for the period of July – September 2019. The three targeted areas are:

This paragraph does not require two sets of textbooks or instructional materials for each pupil.

The materials may be in a digital format as long as each pupil, at a minimum, has and can access the same materials in the class and to take home, as all other pupils in the same class or course in the district and has the ability to use and access them at home.

2. There should be no teacher vacancies or misassignments.

3. School facilities must be clean, safe, and maintained in good repair.

Proposal

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the Capistrano Unified School District and the Laguna Beach Unified School District for adult transition special education services.

Background

The Laguna Beach Unified School District Special Education Department has consistently worked with SELPA staff and Saddleback Valley Unified School District on behalf of students ages 18 to 21 requiring adult transition services. These students are on a Certificate of Educational Completion track and often attend Laguna Beach High School through their senior year. Over the last three years, staff have worked with the SELPA in an effort to enhance their adult transition program by creating additional options for students who are able to attend community college with support for one or two classes. Despite improvement in the program, the SVUSD options continue to be limited to serve the needs of LBUSD students.

The Capistrano Unified School District Transition Program provides more appropriate options for LBUSD students, therefore, District staff collaborated with CUSD to develop a partnership that would permit District students to attend their adult transition program should the IEP team believe that CUSD's adult transition program is the most appropriate placement. The costs associated with a CUSD placement are the same as the costs for placing a student at SVUSD.

Budget Impact

Program cost per month per student is \$2,498.16. Additional costs will be accrued should student require specialized services including but not limited to speech and language, 1:1 instructional assistance, visually impaired services, hearing impaired services, audiology or orientation and mobility services.

Recommended Action

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Capistrano Unified School District and Laguna Beach Unified School District for for adult transition special education services.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

This Agreement is made by and between the Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD also referred to herein as the Provider District) and the Laguna Beach Unified School District (LBUSD also referred to herein as the Sending District). CUSD and LBUSD are also referred to individually as Party, and collectively as Parties. This Agreement is based upon the following factual recitals:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Education Code §§ 56195.1 and 56195.5 authorize school districts and special education local plan areas (SELPAs) to enter into agreements to provide for the education of special education students who may reside in other districts or counties;

WHEREAS, Education Code § 56041 provides that, except for those students meeting residency requirements for school attendance specified in Education Code section 48204(a), the district of residence responsible for providing special education and related services to students between the ages of 18-22 years, inclusive, shall be the last district of residence in effect prior to the student attaining the age of majority for non-conserved pupils, as long as and until the parent or parents relocate to a new district of residence, at which time the new district of residence shall become the responsible local educational agency;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 56028 defines a "parent" as a guardian generally authorized to act as the child's parent or authorized to make educational decisions for the child, including a court appointed responsible adult and further provides that the court appointed responsible adult shall be determined to be the "parent" for purposes of determining residency under Education Code section 48200 et. seq.;

WHEREAS, Students are 18+ year old conserved adult students (Students) eligible for special education and related services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA);

WHEREAS, Students parents reside within the boundaries of LBUSD which the Parties believe to be Students district of residence;

WHEREAS, Student currently resides in parent's home and parent desires student to attend school within the boundaries of CUSD;

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this Agreement regarding the provision of special education and related services for Students.

NOW, THEREFORE, CUSD and LBUSD agree as follows:

1. Recitals

The recitals stated above are incorporated into this Agreement.

2. Term of Agreement

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

3. Educational Placement and Services

The Parties agree that Students will be enrolled in an adult transition program within CUSD. CUSD agrees to implement Students Individualized Education Program (IEP) developed by LBUSD, including all related services, and provide Students with a free appropriate public education during the time that Students are enrolled in a CUSD educational program.

In the event CUSD determines it is no longer able to implement Students IEP or to continue to provide Students special education and related services, CUSD shall immediately notify LBUSD of its intent to terminate this MOU, by sending a letter to LBUSD's Director of Special Education and SELPA Operations and this MOU will be considered terminated 60 days following such notification. In the event LBUSD wishes to terminate this MOU, written notice must be provided to CUSD's Assistant Superintendent, SELPA and Special Education Operations and 60 days following such notification this MOU will be considered terminated.

In the event any Student moves out of LBUSD's boundaries, LBUSD shall immediately notify CUSD of Student's change in residence.

4. Annual and Triennial IEP Meetings

CUSD shall notify LBUSD of Students IEP meetings (Student/school request, annual, and triennial review IEP team meetings) by e-mail to LBUSD's Director of Special Education with at least two weeks' advance notice, and LBUSD will provide a representative to participate in the development of the IEP (telephonically or in person). For any change in services specified on the current IEP, a LBUSD representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified LBUSD resources necessary for the implementation of the IEP shall be involved in the development of the IEP. LBUSD will complete assessments/evaluations required for Students triennial assessment/IEP. CUSD will participate and collaborate in the assessment process. If Students request assessment outside this triennial assessment, CUSD will inform LBUSD within two days of the request by notifying LBUSD's Director of Education via e-mail.

5. Due Process Proceedings

If Student or their court appointed responsible adult contests the termination of services by initiating a due process proceeding with the Office of Administrative Hearing (OAH), CUSD will abide by the "stay-put" requirement of state and federal law unless the Students or their court appointed responsible adult agree otherwise or an interim alternative educational placement is deemed lawful and appropriate by LBUSD or OAH.

Upon request by LBUSD, CUSD will fully participate in special education due process proceedings including mediations and hearings, as requested by LBUSD. Full participation shall include, but in no way limited to, cooperating with LBUSD representatives to provide all documentation that pertains to CUSD's adult transition program and/or the implementation of Students IEP.

6. Payment for Educational Placement and Services

LBUSD agrees to fund Student's educational placement and services within CUSD. LBUSD agrees to pay CUSD as follows:

- a. <u>Placement and Services</u>: LBUSD will fund Student's placement in CUSD's Adult Transition Program in accordance with the funding formula included in Exhibit A.
- b. <u>Payment and Final Accounting</u>: A final accounting to determine the cost of attendance and billing costs to LBUSD will be made no later than September 15, 2020 for the 2019-2020 school year.
- c. <u>Attendance</u>: For the purpose of this MOU, Students will be considered enrolled for the 2019-2020 school year. For each month Students are enrolled, payment will be due for all services. To withdraw Students from attendance, this Agreement must be terminated (per Section 3) or Students/District may provide written notice to CUSD by the 25th of the month that Students will not be attending the following month.

7. No Waiver

The failure of CUSD in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Agreement or to exercise any option herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment to any extent of the right to assert or rely upon such terms or option on any future occasion.

8. Hold Harmless

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the gross negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of LBUSD, CUSD hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend LBUSD and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with CUSD's performance of services during the term of this Agreement.

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the gross negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of CUSD, LBUSD hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend CUSD and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with the performance of services other than for the operation of CUSD during the term of this Agreement.

9. Independent Contractors

CUSD and LBUSD, in the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Each party understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of either of the parties to this Agreement. Each party assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of its employees as they relate to the services to be provided under this Agreement.

10. Complete Agreement

This Agreement is the complete Agreement of the Parties. Any amendments hereto shall be in writing and shall be dated and executed by both Parties.

11. Applicable Law

This Agreement is governed by California state and federal law, and shall be interpreted as if jointly drafted by the Parties to this Agreement.

12. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

13. Counterparts

This Agreement may be signed in counterparts. A copy or original of this document with all signature pages appended together shall be deemed a fully executed Agreement. Facsimile signatures shall be deemed as binding as original signatures.

14. Authorized Signatures

The individuals signing this Agreement warrant that they are authorized to do so, and further, that they are authorized to make the promises in this Agreement on behalf of the respective Parties.

15. Governing Board Approval

This Agreement is contingent upon approval by the Parties' respective Governing Boards.

Proposal

Staff proposes the Board of Education approves an independent contractor agreement with MacMillan Speakers Bureau for consulting services by Marc Brackett, Ph.D. to serve as a keynote speaker at Laguna Beach Unified School District's third annual LBUSD Presents event on March 12, 2020, and provide additional faculty professional development presentations.

Background

In May 2018, the District hosted a parent/community speaking event with Mrs. Julie Lythcott-Haims, author of the book, *How to Raise an Adult: Break Free from the Overparenting Trap and Prepare Your Kid for Success (2015)*. One of the outcomes of that event was Laguna Beach High School's participation in Stanford University's Challenge Success program in the 2018-2019 school year. The purpose of Challenge Success is to support students to be independent, adaptable, ethical, and engaged critical thinkers and to foster learners who are healthy, motivated, resilient, and prepared for the wide variety of tasks they will face as adults.

In May 2019, the District hosted a parent/community speaking event with the co-founder of Challenge Success, Dr. Denise Pope, co-author of the book, *Overloaded and Underprepared: Strategies for Stronger Schools and Healthy, Successful Kids.* Dr. Pope worked with parents and staff on the topic of the well-balanced student and her team's research has supported strategic initiatives at Laguna Beach High School (LBHS) in the design of the student schedule and refinement of the social-emotional support services provided to students.

In support of the District's ongoing commitment to the positive development of the whole child and integrated focus on best practice instruction, effective prevention and intervention systems in the area of social and emotional health, staff proposes to host Dr. Marc Brackett, founder of the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence and professor in the

Keller/Winston/Viloria

Yale Child Study at the Yale School of Medicine as the next LBUSD Presents speaker on March 12, 2020. Dr. Brackett's research on the power of emotions to motivate and engage young people in school and life is well-aligned with the District's K-12 work in the area of social-emotional support and the education of the whole child.

Staff also proposes that Dr. Brackett deliver multiple professional development sessions to K-12 faculty, staff, and administrators, in addition to an evening keynote to parents, staff, and community members. The culminating keynote will showcase work from his book, *Permission to Feel: Unlocking the Power of Emotions to Help Our Kids, Ourselves, and Our Society Thrive (2019)*. Most notably, the speaking event aims to share research and strategies to support healthy, motivated, and engaged students.

Budget Impact

The cost for this presentation is \$20,000 plus travel expenses (round trip airfare, ground transportation, airport parking fees, and hotel), not to exceed \$2,500. This cost includes the keynote parent/community education session and up to three (3) additional faculty/administration sessions. The costs for these speaking engagements will be paid from the general fund.
