Weather reminders

With colder weather

here please be sure to send your child to school with the appropriate cold-weather gear: jacket, gloves/mittens, scarves, closed-toed shoes, etc. If you would like assistance in this area, please contact our school's counselars or social worker.

Severe weather Reunification:

Due to severe weather, lightening, wind or snow, Grand Mountain is unable to release students safely to parents. Staff will relocate students to areas that parents can go to inside the school for pick up.

- Preschool and Kindergarten will remain in their rooms and parents can pick them up there.
- 2. 1st grade, 2nd grade and 3rd grade will move to the cafeteria and parents can enter through the front door and into the cafeteria.
- 3. 4th grade, 5th grade, 6th grade, 7th grade and 8th grade will move to the gym parents can enter through the front doors and into the gym.
 - 4. Teachers are to escort their class to the assigned areas.

Once the parent unites with their child they will exit out the front doors. Phone calls to parents will be made for remaining students.

If busses are able to run, students will be released to load the bus. If busses are unable to run students will be picked up in the above areas by parents.

Red Flag Day Procedures:

Red Flag Days will occur when the temperature during morning arrival (including wind chill) is below 25 degrees. The red flag will fly under the Colorado flag at the front of the building indicating Red Flag status. We are awaiting the installation of a red flag pole at the back of the building as well. An announcement will also be made at 7:25 a.m.

- a. Kindergarten students should enter the building through their exterior classroom doors and will be supervised by kindergarten teachers.
- b. Students in grades I-4 should enter the building via the back cafeteria door entrance.
 This door will unlock at 7:25 a.m. Students in grades I-4 should report to their grade level wings and will sit in assigned areas outside of their classrooms.
- c. Students in grades 5-8 will enter the building via the back gym door entrance. Students in grade 5 will sit with their classes at the half-court line. Grades 6-8 will sit in rows along the south wall of the gym.
 - d. Breakfast will continue as usual in the cafeteria.
 - e. Parents must check-in through the Front Office in order to enter the building.



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We have plenty of bike rack space now, please remind your child if they ride to utilize the bike racks, not trees or lamp posts.
