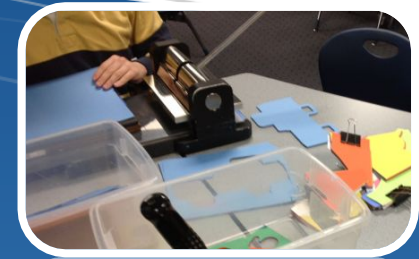
All Notepads & More...
