Dear Alumni and Friends of Central Catholic,

Is Catholic education sustainable in the 21st Century?

To understand the pressing nature of this question, one needs look no further than Greater Lawrence. Here, over a dozen once-thriving Catholic elementary and high schools have closed their doors since the 1970s. Every one of these now-defunct Catholic schools provided excellent education to generations of youngsters. The Greater Lawrence experience is replicated across America.

Meanwhile, the need for what Catholic schools provide – academic rigor, high expectations, a nurturing environment, ethical and spiritual formation – is as strong as ever. In a city with a large school-age (and largely Catholic) population, many Lawrence families yearn for an alternative to the public schools. Many simply cannot afford a Catholic education. This gap – between the cost of Catholic schools and the ability of families to pay that cost – is the single most salient factor driving Catholic school closings in recent decades.

One important piece in solving this puzzle is the establishment and growth of robust endowments to underwrite the costs associated with Catholic education. In this issue of the Emblem you will read about Central Catholic's endowment and the increasingly vital role it plays in sustaining our mission.

Currently valued at approximately \$7 million, our endowment may seem lush compared to a typical family's savings account. Consider what our endowment must do for our students and their families:

- Essentially every dollar generated by our endowment is used for student financial aid.
- Roughly 30% of Central Catholic students receive need-based tuition assistance, without which attendance at Central Catholic would be impossible for these youngsters.
- In 2010-2011, CCHS awarded approximately \$1.3 million in need-based financial aid.
- Each year the endowment provides 4.5% of its total value as expendable dollars roughly \$300,000 far less than our annual financial aid costs.

Clearly, the Central Catholic Endowment Fund must continue to grow in order to fully support the financial aid needs of our students and their families.

Please join me in saluting all those who have established endowed funds for Central Catholic. Among our most recent benefactors, the New Balance Foundation is highlighted in these pages. We are very excited about their substantial investment in Central Catholic and the impact it will have in the lives of students for years to come.

Is Catholic education sustainable in the 21st Century? Thanks to those who support us so generously – many, out of gratitude for their own CCHS experience – the answer at Central Catholic continues to be an enthusiastic "yes!"

Tearly twenty years ago Central Catholic made a tough choice. Renouncing the opportunity to relocate outside the city, school leaders decided to renew the CCHS commitment to the founding vision of Brother Florentius. In 1935 this heroic Marist Brother recognized the need to expand the opportunity for a Catholic high school education to the children of the newest waves of immigrant families living in Lawrence and vicinity. Seventyfive years later Central Catholic steadfastly continues to fulfill his vision "in the midst of Lawrence Citv."

The Critical Case for Endowment

Today, as always, hundreds of families sacrifice mightily to send their children to Central Catholic. Many CCHS parents work second jobs; often students themselves work part- or full-time. Income from veterans' and social security benefits, help from extended families, second mortgages and transitional assistance

can be pieces in the financial puzzle for many families. Nevertheless, the dream of a four-year Central Catholic education will remain out of reach for scores of deserving students each year until the Endowment can support their financial needs (see the chart on page 4.) In 2010-11, thirty percent of Central Catholic students received need-based tuition assistance; \$1.3 million in total was granted to CCHS students and families for this purpose.

Annual donations to the school from individuals, businesses and foundations help to fund this considerable mission-critical expense. Often unpredictable, these sources are never sufficient to meet the needs. To guarantee a first-rate Catholic college preparatory education for the children of Greater Lawrence for generations to come, the Central Catholic Endowment Fund must play an increasingly significant role in funding financial aid. ment Committee, states "Without the appropriate level of endowment and its careful management, no institution of Central Catholic's nature can survive in the long term. It takes endowment and its income, along with tuition and other revenue sources to continue and preserve both the educational and spiritual mission of Central Catholic."

The Progress of the Endowment

Currently, Central Catholic's Endowment is valued at approximately \$7 million. This highwater mark represents remarkable growth since 1998 when the Endowment's value was less than \$800,000. In 1999, personally witnessing Central Catholic's outstanding record of preparing Lawrence's students for college, Kingman and Dee Webster made a \$1 million leadership gift to the Endowment. This transformational act of philanthropy brought heightened focus to the CCHS Endowment and its crucial role in preserving the mission of Central Catholic High School in perpetuity. In the 2010-2011 school year, new gifts to the Endowment totaled \$677,000. This progress notwithstanding, distributions from the Endowment currently

represent slightly less than 20% of the financial aid dollars awarded to students.

The Future of the Endowment

"The courageous decision Central Catholic made to remain in Lawrence will be an empty one unless the School can preserve the socioeconomic and cultural diversity that has been the hallmark of its student body since its founding. This decision presents challenges to all of us at CCHS", declares Patrick Maraghy '64, Chair of the CCHS Finance Committee and Board Treasurer. Maraghy adds, "The Endowment, to the extent it can continue to grow strongly, will permit Central Catholic to fulfill its promise and mission as a Catholic secondary school in the Merrimack Valley."

Professional investment managers with extensive experience serving educational institutions handle the Endowment Fund's investment portfolio. The Central Catholic Investment Committee - comprised of CCHS Board members and other expert volunteers oversees the work of these investment managers and formulates the policies governing the Endowment. The Investment Committee is, in turn, answerable to the CCHS Board of Directors. Central Catholic's investment strategy is prudent, conservative with respect to risk, and consistent with Roman Catholic principles of socially responsible investing.

An array of philanthropic initiatives at CCHS addresses the spectrum of everyday needs and capital equipment (the demand for cutting-edge technology resources is critical – and

expensive). While addressing an array of fundraising priorities – for example, the Annual Fund ensures the sustainability of our athletic and extracurricular programs year-to year - the CCHS Office of Institutional Advancement is sharply focused on future Endowment Fund growth. "Ten years ago, the Endowment was a relatively hard sell for many donors, who typically preferred to see the immediate impact of their charitable giving," according to CCHS president, Bro. Thomas P. Long, FMS '73. "Today, donors are increasingly insightful about how gifts to the Endowment provide them a permanent bond with the

school and its mission and ensure that their philanthropic goals are realized forever. Endowment is the quintessential gift that keeps on giving." Bro. Tom attributes the remarkable growth in the CCHS endowment in recent years in part to this insight among donors.

To well serve Central Catholic's mission and the needs of its students, experts have suggested that a \$20 million long-term Endowment

goal is prudent. Hitting this target will depend on the generosity of individual donors, private foundations, gifts of stock and planned and estate gifts. "If we don't keep striving for such a goal, we will never achieve it," asserts a confident Ron Maheu '60, "and the young men and women of Lawrence and the Merrimack Valley deserve the gift of a Central Catholic education today more than ever."

New Balance Foundation Bestows \$250,000 Endowment Gift

In 1935, Central Catholic High School opened its doors with a mission of providing a first-class college preparatory education to the children of the waves of immigrant families in Greater Lawrence. Over time, Central Catholic's commitment to the education of the youth of the city has created natural and enduring partnerships with similarly committed Lawrence organizations, among these: the Lawrence Boys & Girls Club, the Adelante School Success Program, and CCHS' newest partner and benefactor, the New Balance Foundation.

Since the mid-1980's, Central Catholic's Montagne Project has provided opportunities for inner-city students to attend CCHS. Montagne Project students come from families whose incomes are at or below poverty level. The Project has been highly successful with over 99% of Montagne Project graduates enrolling in college or university studies.

Bro. Thomas Long, FMS, '73 president of Central Catholic, states "As successful as the Montagne Project has been, many more students could attend Central Catholic if the financial resources were available. The New Balance Foundation has generously stepped forward to make a difference for Lawrence's youth with a major gift of \$250,000 to Central Catholic's Montagne Project. This remarkable gift will endow the "New Balance Scholarship" for a member of the Lawrence

Boys & Girls Club in perpetuity. We are enormously grateful for their leadership investment in the education of qualified, economically disadvantaged young men and women."

"The New Balance Foundation has a deeply held mission to support non-profit organizations whose efforts work for the betterment of our children and our communities. Central Catholic and the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence are respected and enduring institutions in Lawrence who share the mission of the New Balance Foundation. We are proud to partner with them through the CCHS Montagne Project", states Anne Davis, Managing Trustee of the New Balance Foundation. Yeraldo Rodriguez, son of Damaris Rodriguez of Lawrence, has been named the first New Balance Scholar at Central Catholic. Rodriguez, a top student in the graduating class at Lawrence's Bruce School, is a member of the National Junior Honor Society, served as president and treasurer of the Student Council, and participated in the Academic Bowl. Rodriguez has been a member of the Boys & Girls Club for four years.

From Refugee Camp to College Campus

Portune will graduate from Central Catholic in May 2012 and enroll in university studies. His promising future is nothing short of a miracle, considering a few short years ago he and his family fled refugee camps in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and

Mozambique. By comparison, the dire prospects of life in a refugee camp held greater promise of hope for Fortune and his family than the civil war, random killings and sinking economic conditions in the DRC. After Fortune's father completed the tortuous path to the USA, he saved enough money to send for his family. Fortune arrived in Lawrence four years ago, knowing little English and struggled through 8th grade. Though seeing CCHS as only a dream, he applied and was accepted. However, with the family's impoverished condition, the tuition was out of his family's reach. CCHS would remain an unfulfilled dream.

At about the same time four years ago that Fortune was contemplating applying to Central Catholic, an anonymous benefactor from Florida, with no history of involvement at Central Catholic, stepped forward upon hearing of CCHS' mission to provide a proven first-rate college preparatory education to inner-city students. The benefactor's magnanimous gesture included a gift of \$250,000 to the CCHS Endowment Fund. This generous contribution to the Endowment enabled Fortune's dream of attending Central Catholic to become a reality. In the future, the endowment gift will continue to provide life-changing educational experiences for still other deserving students.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund come in all shapes and sizes. Endowment gifts have ranged from several hundred dollars up to \$1 million. Gifts to the Endowment Fund can come in the form of stock transfers, estate gifts or bequests, charitable trusts and in cash. 

Niall Murphy '99, (1979-2011) The sudden passing in February 2011 of Raider athletic legend, Niall Murphy '99, stunned and deeply saddened the Central Catholic community. Niall had battled diabetes from his early childhood. 'He was such a good person and a great leader. In my 27 years at Central Catholic, he was the best athlete I've coached. He was as quality a young man as I have come across in my years working with student-athletes," states Chuck Adamopoulos, head football coach at CCHS.

In the classroom, Murphy was a consistent honors student, ranking in the top 15% of his class. Beyond academics, he served on Student Council, as a Student Ambassador, and as a volunteer for Lazarus House.

Considered one of the greatest studentathletes in Central Catholic, MVC and Eastern Massachusetts history, Murphy guarterbacked the Raider football team to the 1997 and the 1998 Eastern Massachusetts Super Bowl title. He was known for his big plays in the most meaningful moments. In track, Murphy was an All-State Champion in both the 110 hurdles and the 300 hurdles. Murphy was named the Eagle Tribune Max Bishop Athlete of the Year in 1998 among many other distinctions. Murphy was co-captain of three sports (football, indoor track, outdoor track) and won the prestigious Michael Garvey Male Student-Athlete Award in 1999.

Upon graduating from Central Catholic, Murphy earned his Bachelor Degree from Harvard University. At Harvard, he was a four-year football standout as a defensive back. Murphy was named first-team All Ivy league, helping to lead Harvard to two Ivy League championships in 2002 and 2003. In 2008, Murphy was inducted into the Central Catholic Athletic Hall of Fame. At the time of his passing Murphy was






Athletic Hall of Fame
