

In September 2013, freshmen at Central Catholic will experience a new and highly engaging learning environment. Teaching and learning at CCHS will be substantially transformed by a school-wide, wireless, one-to-one student computing program which will be phased-in over four years starting with the incoming class of 2017. Using next-generation iPad devices, every student and teacher in every classroom will benefit from a powerful medium for direct, participatory, interactive learning – the kind of learning that is deeper and more enduring as demonstrated by abundant educational research.

Is this meaningful change or just another fad? The results of our nine-month pilot study with teachers and students convince me that this is no fad. While tablet computing will undoubtedly look very different five years from now, the underlying shift to a learning process literally "in the hands" of students is, I believe, permanent. This transformation strengthens what has always been the most highly prized role of teachers in relationship to students: as coaches and models of critical thought, systematic inquiry, and the precise expression of ideas.

EClass 2012



aking history as the largest graduating class ever at Central Catholic, the 343 graduates from 30 cities and towns added unforgettable pages to the annals of excellence for which Central Catholic is known throughout New England. The Class of 2012 will be forever remembered for its superb academic achievements, its selfless service to the marginalized of our region, its artistic and creative accomplishments, its athletic successes, and its effusive Raider spirit that brought back memories of glory days. The unbreakable friendships formed by this class with each other and with the CCHS faculty clearly demonstrate the "family spirit" which will endure through a lifetime.

Academically, the Class of 2012 established new levels of superb achievement in advanced study. 179 of its members were enrolled in Advanced Placement courses with results that vaulted far above national and regional averages. Incredibly, 94% of AP students scored at the competency level or higher on 329 AP exams, while 35% attained the maximum possible score. Fortyfour of the graduates of the Class of 2012 were named AP Scholars in recognition for superior scores on 3 or more AP Exams. 98.4% of the 2012 grads went directly on to higher education with 95% headed to 280 different 4-year colleges in 20 states, while earning \$3.5 million in scholarships for the first year of college.

The Class of 2012 put their compassionate Christian faith into action by volunteering over 14,500 hours of service to the "least favored" in nearly 100 local agencies in our region. They had a part in raising \$96,000 for cancer research over their four years through the CCHS Catwalk 4 Cancer Fashion Show, as well as over \$40,000 for needy families in the "Christmas Project", the partnership between CCHS and Merrimack Valley Catholic Charities and St. Mary Church. When it came to Raider Spirit, the Class of 2012 re-ignited the energy and enthusiasm that are legendary when it comes to athletics, extracurricular activities and CCHS fandom. The Class of 2012 led the way with MVC championships in Girls Volleyball, Girls Indoor Track, Girls Outdoor Track (also MA State Champs), Softball, Boys Basketball, Ice Hockey (also Super 8 semi-finalist) and Boys Outdoor Track as MA State Champs. Creatively, the class of 2012 demonstrated their talents in performances of "Alice In Wonderland", "Li'l Abner", the A Capella and Concert Chorus, Concert & Jazz Band and extensive Art Expositions.

The Class of 2012 celebrated their Baccalaureate Mass at St. Mary Church on May 24 and the 74th Commencement Exercises were held in the Memorial Gymnasium on May 25 with over 2,500 families and friends joining in this memorable celebration of achievement.





The two visionary men worked determinedly with Lawrence officials and purchased the parcel of land from Auburn Street to the Spicket River for a cost of approximately \$9,000 for the school's home.

Starting with the incoming freshman class, and phasing over the succeeding years, every student and teacher will be equipped with a next generation iPad. The iPad will lead to richer collaboration between teachers and students, a powerful tool for organization and independent research, an efficient means of completing and submitting assignments, and be cost effective as textbooks are available in much cheaper electronic form. A LONG RIDE HOME Did you know that CCHS has students who travelled as many as 9,000 miles to get to school? Thirty-five full-time students are members of the International Student

Program whose families live in China, South Korea, Vietnam and Switzerland. "International Raiders" live the entire school year with their CCHS host families. When the school year is over, they head back home for the summer and return in the fall. SETTING NEW COURSES

Continuing to advance the educational opportunities open to students, CCHS teachers developed 15 new courses



MAKING THE WORLD A

The ONE DAY Christian Service Learning Program at CCHS asks each student to give 24 hours of volunteer service to the "least favored" – the poor, the infirmed, the homeless, the hungry and others in need in the Merrimack Valley and Southern NH. The Class of 2012 alone volunteered over 14,500 hours of service in over 100 local social service organizations before they graduated last May.

LET THERE BE LIGHTS

The former Essex County Jail site was transformed into an athletic practice field for use by football, lacrosse, throwers in track & field, and occasionally other sports and outdoor activities in physical education. In September 2012, CCHS installed light towers around the practice field enabling student-athletes to take advantage of late afternoon and evening practices for its vibrant athletic program.

NEW CALENDARS

This is certainly true for teachers and students with the adoption of a new daily class schedule in which classes meet five times in a 7-day cycle with classes 65 minutes long. This schedule permits deeper, more enduring learning and a focus on developing the skills of problem-solving, critical thinking and collaboration. Students now have greater flexibility to choose more electives and enroll in AP courses earlier.

EVERYBODY'S TALKING



The days of hiding behind a

student in foreign language class and suffering anxiously as you wait your name to be called to speak in class are over! With the assistance of grants from the Abbott and Dorothy H. Stevens Foundation and the Demoulas Foundation, CCHS has transformed a locker room into a stateof-the-art digital language learning lab. Students now simultaneously respond to teacher questions and dialog lessons in personal PC recording stations.



BEFORE MTV THERE WAS CCHS

The CCHS Memorial Gymnasium has a pop musical history of some note. "Little Stevie Wonder" performed in concert in the Gymnasium in 1965 and shortly after rocketed to mega-stardom. A year later, "Sam the Sham and the Pharoahs" entertained the young crowd with their unique stylings. In 1968, "The Grass Roots" rocked a packed audience into a near frenzy. Even the "oldies" were rejuvenated when "Herb Reed and the Platters" came to play in the mid-1980's.

THE 'RED & BLUE' AND THE ORANGE

Since 2011, Central Catholic has been a partner in Syracuse University's Project Advance. Having trained with professors at Syracuse University, CCHS faculty, **Richard Cavanaugh** and **Bridgette Bolduc**, lead courses in Honors Physics and Honors Forensic Science respectively, with students able to receive Syracuse University credits for these courses. The SU credits are transferable to US colleges and universities.



RE-STOCKING THE WOODPILE

Year in and year out, alumni demonstrate their gratitude for the education, values and life lessons instilled in their years at Central Catholic. Of the nearly \$3 million raised to support CCHS students and programs in 2010 and 2011, 56% came from both large and smaller gifts from devoted CCHS alumni. GOING THE DISTANCE

While students have access to 131 courses taught by CCHS faculty, juniors and seniors also have the opportunity to choose from another 150 online, distance-learning courses taught by certified instructors as part of Central's membership in the Virtual High School (VHS) Consortium of schools. At present, 47 students are enrolled in over 30 different online courses. **Dennis King**, CCHS Science Department chair who teaches "Genes & Disease" online, coordinates the online VHS program.

The CCHS student body reflects the diversity of the world of the 21st century. Gender: 683 boys and 651 girls, hailing from 42 different cities and towns in MA and NH and 4 foreign countries. While 82% are Catholic, students professing a variety of faith traditions enrich the CCHS community. The racial backgrounds of students are very diverse and include: White, Hispanic, Black, Multi-Racial, Pacific Islanders and Asian. Students blend seamlessly into a learning community that promotes understanding and benefits each student by its diverse intellectual, spiritual, social and cultural exchanges.

HEARTS WITHOUT BOUNDS

In the last decade, CCHS students moved by compassion for the needs of the local community and wider world have inaugurated two extraordinary events: the annual "Christmas Project" and "The Catwalk 4 Cancer" Through the Christmas Project, students have raised over \$120,000 to assist 50 local families in need of food, clothing, gifts and children's necessities at Christmas. Similarly five years ago, touched by the incidence of cancer in their families and acquaintances, more than 200 students yearly have put on the "Catwalk 4 Cancer Fashion Show," raising over \$130,000 for cancer research and treatment at the Dana Farber Cancer Center, the Jimmy Fund and the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation.





The \$35,000 Alumni Challenge Grant seeks to increase alumni participation

Fifty-six percent of the financial support Central Catholic received in 2011-2012 came from loyal alumni in gifts from \$5, \$50, \$100, \$500, up to several thousand and the extraordinary pledge of \$250,000 to be completed this year from **Richard '61** and **Marilyn Santagati**. The Kaslow Family Memorial Fund: An Intergenerational "Thank You"

What is it that transforms the relationship between a graduate of Central Catholic from a deeply felt debt of gratitude to one of passionately supporting the schools' ongoing mission? For **Jack Kaslow '49** and his wife, **Barbara '51**SM, there were several steps in this evolution.

Jack's debt of gratitude flowed firstly from his four years on scholarship aid, aid that made it possible to attend Central Catholic. Secondly, the inspired efforts of his teachers and the academic motivation instilled in him led to his achievement as Valedictorian of the Class of 1949. Beyond Central Catholic's academic excellence, Jack also cites the life lessons taught by many of the Marist Brothers – so meaningful that he and other CCHS grads still reminisce about how they helped shape who they are. Jack and Barbara's appreciation grew more palpably as they followed the path of their three sons through CCHS, **Charlie '75**, **John '76 and Tom '81**. By that time, Central's faculty was comprised of both Marist Brothers and lay teachers. Jack and Barbara were impressed by the traditional values and scholarly credentials of the lay teachers which mirrored those of the Brothers.

The Kaslow's bond with CCHS deepened, interestingly enough, with the passing of Jack's father, Charles. Charles had great respect for the Marist Brothers and with the quality of the education his son and grandsons had received. When he died, the Kaslows sought a way to honor their Dad's life and values in a respectful, enduring and valuable way. It was at this time that their appreciation and gratitude for CCHS found meaningful expression in the establishment of a modest scholarship fund. Subsequently, three close family members passed away and they continued thoughtful memorial gifts to the Kaslow Family Memorial Fund.

Joining Jack's deep fondness for Central Catholic, Barbara, a Saint Mary High School alumna, felt a sincere kinship to CCHS as her alma mater found a new home at CCHS in various ways. The most inspiring facet was yet to come in developing a heartfelt relationship to Central Catholic.

The transformation from gratitude to passionate support of CCHS' educational mission was powerfully triggered by occasional visits to the school. Hearing the life stories of students and how CCHS had changed their lives, their self-confidence to face challenges, given each a well-founded belief that a limitless future was within their grasp, deeply moved Jack and Barbara. The Kaslows recognized that many of these young men and women would not have had the "Central experience" without scholarship assistance. Jack fondly states, "There is such an uplifting, respectful and energized atmosphere throughout the school. The culture at CCHS underscores Brother Tom Long's description of the 'Central Experience' as embodying superior academic achievement and deep sense of caring for one another among the student body and faculty. What a positive environment for children for authentic learning, personal growth and confidence in their ability to build a bright future!"
