## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (YEAR 11)**

1. **Coursework** (or Controlled Assessments)

Formal coursework/controlled assessments tasks will be ongoing throughout Year 11; these will take place during normal timetabled lessons.

## 2. GCSE Examinations

- Note 1. Appropriate revision during the Easter and summer half-term breaks is **essential** please make holiday plans accordingly.
- Note 2. GCSE Art examinations start in the first half of the spring term.
- Note 3. GCSE Drama practical examinations take place early in the second half of the spring term in Year 11.
- Note 4. The IGCSE English as a Second Language oral typically takes place towards the end of the spring term in Year 11.
- Note 5. The IGCSE English Language Speaking & Listening assessment typically takes place in the second half of the spring term in Year 11.
- Note 6. The IGCSE PE practical examination typically takes place towards the end of the spring term in Year 11.
- Note 7. Revision at home and Examination Leave the detailed arrangements will be confirmed in a letter sent from the Deputy Head (Academic), available via the Parent Portal, at the start of the summer term. Typically, examination leave may be taken from half-term in the summer term.
- Note 8. Pupils following BTEC programmes may not take examination leave until they have completed all their assignments and have permission from the relevant Head of Department.
- Note 9. Post-examination routine following the GCSE examination period the Year 11 'normal' timetable is the post-GCSE programme (details of which are sent home in the Easter mailing). All Year 11 pupils at Millfield at this time will be required to take part in this programme which will typically run during the final week of the summer term.
- <u>Note 10</u>. The above arrangements must on no account conflict with school commitments; team players, musicians and those involved in other group activities must refer to the appropriate staff.

### 3. Academic Trips, Visits, Exchanges and Fieldwork

A number of trips, visits, exchanges and fieldwork activities take place throughout Year 11 which support pupils' academic studies. Where necessary, parents will be given as much notification as possible of the precise dates of these activities. In some subjects, participation is regarded as an essential part of the course.

## 4. Spring term GCSE Rehearsal examinations

The GCSE Rehearsal examinations are an important opportunity for pupils and teachers to gauge levels of progress. Pupils are strongly advised to prepare for these internal examinations to ensure that they are in a position to perform to their potential. Extensive revision during the preceding Christmas break is strongly advised to consolidate the work covered so far. Parents are encouraged to make any holiday arrangements with this in mind. Experience shows that lack of preparation for Rehearsal examinations is an indicator for likely under-performance in the real thing. The outcomes from these examinations will be important evidence which will inform decisions on the tier of entry for terminal examinations.

## 5. Reporting

Reports are provided at the end of the autumn and spring terms and at half-term in the autumn term. The reports at half-term in the autumn term and at the end of the spring term are A4 summary sheets; the report at the end of the autumn term is a full booklet. Parents will receive a summary of GCSE Rehearsal grades in advance of the Year 11 Parents' Meeting. A Housemaster/Housemistress letter (plus any co-curricular reports) will be sent home at the end of the summer term. Reporting sessions are used by group tutors and Housemasters/Housemistresses to closely monitor pupil performance and progress. Parents are contacted as appropriate following reporting sessions if a pupil is not meeting academic expectations.
