<p>Program Overview:</p>	<p>Pathways in Technology Early College High Schools (P-TECH) is an open-enrollment program that provides students with work-based education. As part of the Criminal Justice program, students take courses that provide the academic, technical, and workplace skills that are attractive to employers. Students have the potential to earn an associate’s degree in four years, along with industry certificates for their selected career pathway. These opportunities can potentially lead to paid internships and job placement after graduation. Students have the opportunity to earn up to 60 hours of tuition-free college credit while pursuing their high school diploma.</p>
